- Grad Post-Secondary Information

 - Application Process/Deadlines (vary)
 - Open House/Info Session dates: All Post Secondary institutions
 - Online and Virtual Tours being done so find out dates online.
- Some schools are accepting applications now as of Oct. 1st
 - Some are "first-come, first-served" (e.g. KPU, Douglas, UFV)
- Application Deadlines
 - ▶ UBC Early Admission apply now (Dec 1)! Regular Admission Jan. 15, 2025
 - ▶ SFU Jan. 31, 2025
 - UVIC Jan. 31, 2025
 - ▶ All other BC institutions have varying deadlines depending on the program.

Things change year to year!

- You will need to keep checking websites for schools that you are interested in for the most up to date information.
- Any new updates or information will be given in our GPS meetings and on EMS Post-Secondary Microsoft TEAMS
- ▶ If you are planning on taking a gap year, please still apply to your intended Post Secondary institutions now! This will help you in the future. You may also be able to defer your start date.

Distributed Learning Courses:

Deadline to complete is June 30, 2025. However, if you want the course to be considered as part of your admission average you must have completed at least 50% of the course by Mar. 1, 2025 and need an interim as proof.

If you need a mid-term mark from an online course, YOU must contact the online school as EMS does not have access to your marks.

Why you need to complete the STS:

- 1. To give the Ministry of Education permission to release your marks to the Post Secondary Institutions (PSIs) that you will be applying to.
- 2. This will also allow you to review your transcript and refer to it during self reporting. It also gives you the option to download your transcript and send it to your Post Secondary Institutions if needed.
- ➤ 3. This is how you will have access to your transcript after you graduate. EMS will no longer be able to access your transcript.

Submitting Final Grades to Universities

StudentTranscripts Service

You can use the StudentTranscripts Service (STS) to:

- View or order your secondary school transcript
- Send your secondary school transcripts to post-secondary institutions
- Order your graduation certificate
- View your scholarships
- View your provincial exam or graduation assessment results

Submitting Final Grades to Universities

- Required: Student Transcript Service (BCeID)
 - https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/transcripts-and-certificates
- Most Post-Secondary Institutions access student marks electronically from the Ministry of Education (no paper transcripts)
- Students MUST complete their online STS selection to release their marks → link on EMS website under Counselling

Submitting Final Grades to Universities

- https://www.bceid.ca/register/basic/account_details.aspx?type=regular
- Create a BCeID at above site (wait for e-mail to login)
- You will choose from a list (usually 3) Post Secondary institutions
- You must still register directly to the Universities. STS will transfer your final marks electronically in July 2025 as soon as they become available.

 - Register for BASIC BCeID
 - Create/Record User ID + Password
 - Click on 'CONTINUE'
 - Click on 'ACCEPT TERMS'/'CONTINUE'
 - Receive confirmation e-mail
 - Continue to Service Directory
 - Scroll to page 7
- Step 2:
- Click on 'Student Transcript Service' (STSPRD)
- Click on 'SUBSCRIBE NOW'
- Create/Record Account: (use PEN# + BCeID User ID)
- Complete and click 'SUBMIT'
- Step 3:
- Receive confirmation e-mail
- Click on 'ACTIVATE STUDENT TRANSCRIPTS REGISTRATION'
- Enter User ID + Password
- Click 'CONTINUE'
- Wait 5 seconds to be logged in
- Step 4:
- Click on Send/Order Your Transcripts
 Click on 'CONSENT'
- Select PSI's (Post Secondary Institutes) to send transcripts to/move to list
- Click on 'GO TO NEXT STEP'
 Choose 'Send Final Mark When Available' or UBC/SFU: 'Send Transcripts'
 Now & Updates Later' (Change date to 01/09/2019)
- Submit Order/Add order to cart
