- ► Check out our Grade 10-12 Course Planning Tool (*slide #10*), which provides students/parents information to help students make the best choices for their future.



Post-Secondary Considerations

- Universities are now looking at grade 11 and 12 marks.
- Entrance requirements have changed: ensure you are looking at the requirements for your year of entry.
- Universities want to see students challenge themselves academically.
- Direct transition from high school to university is intense. You may wish to consider attending institutions that offer university transfer credits such as KPU, Douglas, Langara, UFV.

Choosing the Math course that is right for you:

There are 3 senior Math courses offered:

- Math Foundations
 - For students interested in University studies
- Pre-Calculus
 - For students interested in University studies
- Math Workplace
 - Designed for entry into many college/trades programs and the workplace

Consider the following:

- > If you have math this semester, talk with your teacher & heed their recommendation.
- If you have math next semester, talk to your teacher from last year or refer to your experience in previous math class.
- > If you are in Workplace Math 10, you will take Workplace Math 11.

Things to consider when selecting Elective courses

What are some reasons to take a course?

- Interested in the topic and need it for post-secondary and/or work after high school
- To learn an important life skill (cooking, accounting, how to change a tire, etc.)
- Further develop a passion (dance/art/computer/etc.) or learn a new hobby
- Something fun and a break from academic work

Remember courses are FREE at North Surrey so use the time to explore and try new things.

Fulfilling work is found at the intersection of what you:

- Love doing (if they didn't pay you would you still do it)
- Are naturally good/talented at
- Care about and value

...Selecting Elective courses continued

- ► Read the NSS <u>Learning Guide</u> to get a sense of what courses are about.
- ▶ Talk to teachers who teach the class to get more information.
- ► Many electives can be taken in grade 10/11/12 without having taken the course in a previous year.
 - For example, if you don't take Art 10, you can still take Art 11.

Choose wisely.....elective changes may be difficult to accommodate.

Additional Information for Elective Courses

- Band 11/CLC (f2f with CLC teacher at NSS)
- Band 12/Study
- Graphic Production (Yearbook) 10/11/12:
 - Semester only; may take both grade 11 and 12 course
- Dance & Drama 10/11/12 courses are leveled:
 - Beginner, Intermediate or Advanced
 - Students should consult with teachers about appropriate course level before selecting one of these courses.
 - Application/Approval Courses:
 - Peer Tutoring (see Ms. Hui for application)
 - Work Experience (see Ms. Cvitkovich)
 - Science Lab Tech (seek approval from Science teacher)



Language Courses

You do not need a Language course to graduate.

Research institutions you're interested in attending for Grade 11 and 12 Language requirements. Check if an Intro 11 Language is approved for admission??

Verify whether universities require a Language 12 or a university equivalent to complete a degree in Arts.

Career Courses

You should have completed Careers 8, 9 and 10.

Career Life Connections may be taken in either Grade 11 or 12.

Options for Career Life Connections (CLC)

- > 4 credits
- ▶ Choose one Career Life Connections (CLC):
 - CLC General
 - CLC Business & Information Technology Passion
 - CLC Band 11 (backed yearlong, Day 1/2 rotation)
- ▶ CLC may be taken in grade 11 or grade 12

Audition Courses (9th course before or after school)

Students may also select a 9th additional course in the following areas. These courses take place before or after school:

Jazz Band
Polaris (Choir)
Theatre
Company
Dance Company

Listen to announcements for auditions taking place in the spring. Auditions will determine final class rosters. If you are accepted, the course will be added to your schedule.

- Intro to Practice for Child and Youth Care Counsellors (Douglas College) for students interested in pursuing a career as a Youth Care Worker or Counsellor
- Intro to Health Sciences (KPU) for students interested in pursuing a career in Health Sciences

There are Other Ways to Get Credits

- Take a course during Summer School or Online.
- Submit documentation to counsellor for:
 - courses completed outside of the district, province or country
 - completed external credits i.e. sports, music, dance, lifesaving, driver's education (ICBC).
- Please see your counsellor if any of these apply to you, or if you have any questions regarding external credits

Summer School

- If you do not meet the learning outcomes of a core academic course, it's recommended that you speak with your counsellor to review options. One option may be summer school.
- ▶ <u>NOTE</u>: Summer school is a *BIG* decision because it condenses 5 months of school work into 5 weeks.
- ▶ Please complete this <u>Online-Summer-Study form (O.S.S.)</u> if you intend to take a summer school course.



Online Courses

You may choose to cross enroll with an online school to take an additional course to advance ahead, or to take a course that you may not have in your schedule.

Please complete the Online-Summer-Study form (O.S.S.) if you intend to take an online course.

Please consider the following characteristics of what a successful online learner looks like:

- Independent learner
- Self-motivated
- Skilled with written communication
- Able to set a schedule and keep it
- Able to meet deadlines

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Can I take all academic classes?

- We recommend you balance your schedule with academic and elective courses
- ▶ Keep in mind if you are looking for top marks, you only have so much time to complete homework and so this has to be something you think about is it better to take less "hard" courses and do well as oppose to take everything but get lower marks as a result

2. What do I do if my marks aren't high enough for the program entry?

- Apply to multiple programs that have different entry requirements
- Ask yourself, "Am I ready for this program"
- College's have many prerequisite courses and so you can start your program of study there and transfer at a later date.

FAQ's continued...

- 3. Can I drop a class after a month if I don't like it or don't like the mark I am getting?
 - ▶ It is ok to take a course that you are not interested in or ends up not being what you thought it would be
 - ► Focus on doing the best you can
 - You may be learning what you don't want to do in the future crossing things of the list of potential job/careers helps narrow things down
 - ► Focus on some other skill/knowledge you can take out of the class (i.e. public speaking skills, computer skills, perseverance, working in a group, etc.)
 - Universities have started to focus more on the marks students get in the COURSES in the field you are applying for rather than a total GPA approach

FAQ's continued...

- 4. Do I need to take EVERY science 11 and science 12 for post-secondary?
 - ▶ No, check admission requirements for each post-secondary
- 5. How do I know what math to take?
 - You need to consider your ability level (how have you done in Math up until now) AND your work habits
 - ► Check with your teacher to see what he/she would recommend
 - Consider future plans of study and prerequisites required (note taking a class because it is "needed for a career path" shouldn't supersede ability and work ethic)
- 6. If I have 60% in Pre-Calculus 11, will I be successful in Pre-Calculus 12?
 - (I plan to work harder and get a tutor)
 - ▶ It is not uncommon to drop 10-15%; *Discuss* with your math teacher if they feel you will be successful in Gr. 12 *and* be *open* to their feedback your teacher is the expert in the curriculum and knows your ability (even despite your effort)

FAQ's continued...

7. Can I go to university having only completed Foundations of Math 11?

▶ Yes, but check requirements of each institution and each faculty

8. Can I choose my teacher or my block order?

▶ No, the computer generates your schedule - counsellors do their best to review each schedule and balance WHERE POSSIBLE

9. Can I take a course online?

- ▶ There are many factors to consider taking a class on line
 - ▶ What is your current course load taking an online course can add a 9th course to your schedule
 - Online is not the same as blended/covid online...it is self paced and you have one full year to complete the course so you must make your own deadlines for each unit and stick to them
 - ► Important to consider University requirements for course completion dates for online courses
