What is LEAP?

LEAP is an experiential and holistic program, founded in the First Peoples Principles of Learning, for students in grades 8-12. The program offers opportunities to participate in field studies, is geared towards cross-curricular learning, and is routed in strength-based, hands-on learning. LEAP focuses on building strong classroom communities where students are not afraid to take risks in their learning.

LEAP runs for two blocks a day for the full year (Block A and B).

LEAP stands for 'Learning from Experience and Aboriginal Perspectives'.




LEAP

Learning through Experience and Aboriginal Perspectives

- LEAP is a Grade 10 interdisciplinary program. The cohort may include Science 10, Active Living 10, First People's English 10/Spoken Word 10, Social Studies 10, and Career Life Education.
- The goal of the program is to learn Big Ideas and develop Core Competencies through a holistic, hands-on approach, with a strong focus of Indigenous perspectives and building a sense of community.
- The program will include themed units related to story telling and communication to investigating major social, economic and political events of the 20th century.
- Along with exploring career opportunities and employability skills, this exciting program may include field trips such as snowshoeing, canoeing, hiking, visiting museums and volunteering in the community.







Classroom Learning

The LEAP classroom is set up to provide students with diverse learning activities. The teachers design their lessons to be engaging and active. We will have guest speakers, work with community partners, and invite local societies in, to enhance the curriculum. Your teachers will often co-teach, and we will use the entire pod space as our classroom.



FOODS LEADERSHIP


- Students will engage in safely planning, preparing and serving food at various events in the school and local community.




