- 1 Elective
- Numeracy 10 assessment
- Literacy 10 Assessment

Minimum 8 courses

Grade 11

Graduation Requirements Only

- 1 English 11
- 1 Socials 12 (taken in grade 11 or grade 12)
- 1 Science
- 4 Electives (could be more sciences, or socials or art etc.)
- Numeracy assessment if not already done

Minimum 8 courses

Grade 12

Graduation Requirements Only

- English 12
- A minimum of 3 additional grade 12 courses
- Career Life Connections 12 (which includes the Capstone project (formerly GTP))
- Electives to complete required number of credits
- Literacy 12 assessment

Minimum total of required credits for grades 10-12 is 80

Each course completed counts 4 credits

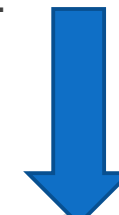

Language Challenge Exam

- ▶ An exam done in January at the Delta School District (registration end of October/early November)
- ▶ Must have documentation of prior learning
- ▶ Can be used as a grade 12 course for graduation and as an entrance course for some universities (NOT for UBC)
- ▶ Satisfies the language requirement for all universities

- All Co-op Programs (grade 11)
- All Career Prep Programs (grades 11 & 12)
- Peer Tutoring (grades 11 & 12)
- Library Science (grades 11 & 12)
- Yearbook (grades 11 & 12)
- Theatre Company (audition grades 11 & 12)

Study Blocks

Grade 12 students:

- You may choose 1 Study Block during online course selection.
- ***Check your credits! You need 80 to graduate!***
- To get a 2ND STUDY BLOCK you must fill out an application which will be available in April
- Be aware that universities look for a rigorous program (with a minimum of 6 grade 12 acceptable courses)

District Partnership Programs:

Several programs are available for a semester of study. Please see Ms. Ramsay or Ms. Martin in Careers to find out more and to fill out an application.

YouthWork: Also, if you are currently working in a trade area you may be eligible for 16 credits toward graduation. See Ms. Ramsay or Ms. Martin

Alternate Learning

Online Courses: Must be completed by the end of January of grade 12 to be used for university entrance in September of the same year

Night School: Can be completed in semester 1 or 2 of grade 12 and be used for university entrance

Applying to University

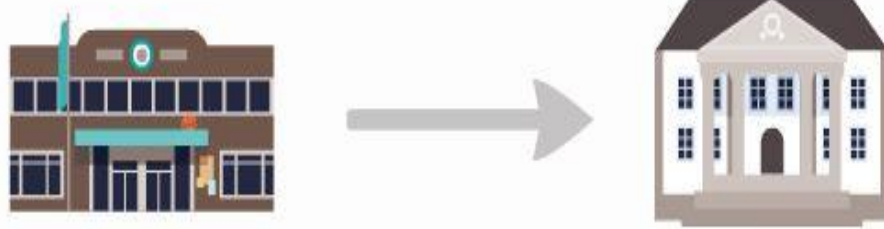
You apply to a specific *Faculty*

eg. Faculty of Arts, Science, Business, Engineering,
Fine Arts (you end up with a “degree” in Science or
Arts etc.)

Some professional programs require a few years of
university with specific courses BEFORE you can apply.
ie. Medicine, Law, Dentistry

The **direct route**: a student enters university directly after graduating high school

And the **transfer route**: a student begins their post-secondary journey at a college to gain credits before attending a university



UBC

General Admission: (minimum 70% English 11/12) plus 6 academic and non-academic courses (not Applied Skills, Leadership, PE or Career Courses)

Personal Profile : 8 questions about school involvement

Degree Specific: Basic list of grade 11 courses (English, Math, Science, Language)

English 12 plus specific faculty requirements

UBC doesn't have an approved list.

Broad Based Admissions

Many post-secondary institutions are also considering a personal profile in addition to admission averages.

For example UBC considers 6 additional areas of personal experience and involvement:

1. Leadership and group contributions
2. Academic achievements
3. Sports involvement
4. Creative and performing arts experience
5. Work experience
6. Volunteer experience and service to others

SFU

General Admission: English 12 and 5 approved grade 12 courses (from a list)

Program Specific Requirements: English 11, Math 11 (min 60%), Science 11, Language 11 (Intro ok), English 12 plus specific and choice courses from List A and/or List B

University Degree rule of Thumb

5 (SFU) or 6 (UBC) grade 12 courses

Arts : English 11, Language 11, Science 11, Math 11 (Pre-Cal or Foundations)

English 12, (Language 12 recommended for UBC)

Science: English 11, Language 11, Physics and Chem 11, Pre-Cal 11

English 12, Pre-Cal 12, and two of Bio 12, Chem 12, or Physics 12 plus other Grade 12 courses

Business: English 11, Language 11, Pre-Cal 11, Science 11

English 12, Pre-Cal 12 plus other academic Grade 12 courses

(Calculus recommended)

Applied Science (Engineering): English 11, Language 11, Pre-calc 11, Physics 11,

Chem 11, English 12, Pre-Calc 12, Physics 12,

Chem 12, Calculus 12 (required by some and recommended for others)

Nursing: Requirements vary - please check individual institutions

English Language Proficiency

You must check each website of the Institutions to which you are applying for details!

Examples: You must study in English in Canada for 3 (SFU) or 4 (UBC) years and achieve an acceptable standing in English 12 (70%)

OR for the English proficiency requirement obtain admission by achieving an acceptable score on one of the English Language assessments such as IELTS, TOEFL, and LPI

Kwantlen will accept entry with a minimum grade of a C in English 12 for many of their programs but as programs are competitive it depends on the program.
