

What are my options to get courses I need to graduate/post-secondary requirements?

- Check if you can make changes to your schedule (Sem 2)
- Take an online course with SAIL Academy
- Take a course at Night School at Queen Elizabeth Secondary School
- Take courses at Summer School (more information will be available in spring)
- *All options require you to meet with your counsellor*

Do I need **volunteer hours** to graduate?

The BC Ministry of Education requires students to complete **30 hours of Career Life Exploration**. This encompasses a variety of things:

- Volunteering
- Paid employment
- Obtaining certifications such as FoodSafe, Serving It Right, CPR Training, etc.
- Attending post-secondary or scholarship information sessions
- 10 hours of your Capstone project

Your hours must be accumulated during the same year you complete Career Life Connections 12.



- Do what's best for you
- It's not where you start, it's where you finish
 - A 1 year certificate program will get you further than dropping out after 2 years of a degree
- Colleges or KPU – cheaper, smaller class sizes, same content, easier transition from high school, easier to get into
- You can start at college or smaller university and transfer later
- Check out info sessions

How do I apply?

Create an account on educationplannerbc.ca

Complete applications on education planner - you can save it and come back to it later

Create account on BCeID to send transcripts

Pay the application fee with a credit card (3 PSIs = 3 fees)

Pay attention to deadlines / back up plan?

After you hit submit, you'll receive a confirmation email

Feb/March - Conditional Acceptance

May/June - Official Acceptance & registration date

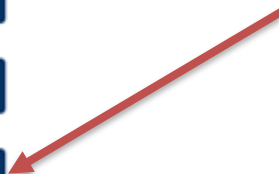
There are three [types of BCeID](#) accounts.

Not sure which one to register for?

The type of BCeID you need depends on the service you want to use. To find out what type you need:

- [Find the service in the service directory](#). Many of the services that use BCeID are listed in the directory.
- If you can't find the service in the directory, check with the service provider and they'll be able to tell you the type.

- Register/Create an Account at www.studenttranscripts.gov.bc.ca
- Sign up for Basic BCeID
- You will need your PEN number (found on MyEdBC)
- You need to use your LEGAL NAME
- YOU MUST ACTIVATE THROUGH YOUR EMAIL WITHIN 24 HOURS

Open vs. Limited Intakes

Open

- Often used in college / small universities
- Applications stay open, no limit on seats
- Grades not taken into consideration beyond minimum requirements
- Examples: KPU arts, business, science programs for first year students

Limited

- Has a set number of seats per application cycle
- Applications stay open until classes are full
- Often have specific requirements (grades, courses)
- **First come, first served**
- **Time is of the essence!**
- Nursing programs, fashion design, trades programs

Competitive Intake

UBC Stats

- For the 2020/2021 school year, UBC assessed over 81,000 personal profiles for undergraduate admissions.
- Mean grade range for all courses completed in gr 11/12
 - 89-91 percent for UBCV
 - 82-84% for UBCO
- They admitted 57% of applicants.

Typically used in universities

They want the best applicants

Will have a closing date

They will evaluate each qualified application after the closing date and admit a set number of the best applicants

UBC vs SFU vs KPU

UBC

- Consider grade 11/12 marks
- Must have a language 11
- Min. 70% English 11/12
- Recommended to have 6 grade 12 courses in addition to English 12
- SAIL courses need to be completed by June 30th
- Need to complete UBC Personal Profile – volunteering, athletics, etc. are taken into consideration
- **Must have a PROFICIENT or 3/4 on the Literacy 12 Assessment**

SFU

- Consider grade 11/12 marks
- Must have a language 11
- Min. 70% in English 12
- Must have 5 approved grade 12 courses
- SAIL courses need to be completed by June 30th

KPU

- Min. C+ in English 12 for all arts, science and business programs
- Limited intake programs may have more specific requirements

Stopping and Starting

2 year diploma – LPN

- Work for a few years
- Go to UBC or BCIT for 3 more years to become an RN

1-2 year diploma – Education Assistant

- Work for a few years
- Go to SFU for 3 more years to become a teacher

Stopping / Starting

Transferring from one PSI to another

- Some programs are geared towards upgrading (LPN, EA, PLP)
- www.bctransferguide.ca
- If you are planning to start at a smaller institute and transfer to a larger university, make sure to check the requirements using the BC Transfer Guide
- Know the course codes at each institution so you can search both ways
- Credits are almost always transferable

OR

UBCV CHEM 111 Structure, Bonding and Equilibrium in Chemistry =

- Douglas CHEM 1XXX – no direct equivalent but Douglas will accept credits

 - Set aside time each week to search for & complete applications
 - Fill out the KP Scholarship Profile found on the KP Career Centre Team
 - Save every application you do: revise and reuse
 - [Partners 36](#) (for Surrey Students only)
- Money set aside for KP students specifically
 - Everyone should apply
 - \$500 - \$1250
 - Categories include:
 - Applied Skills
 - Community Service
 - Fine Arts
 - Indigenous Languages and Culture
 - Physical Activity
 - Trades and Technical Training
 - Principal's and Vice Principals Awards

Final Thoughts from Ms. Duffield

- **Be organized** – documents, transcripts, references, application deadlines
- **You don't have to have it figured out right now**
- **Consider taking a GAP year**
- **DO NOT go to UBC or BCIT to “find yourself” or “figure things out.”**
