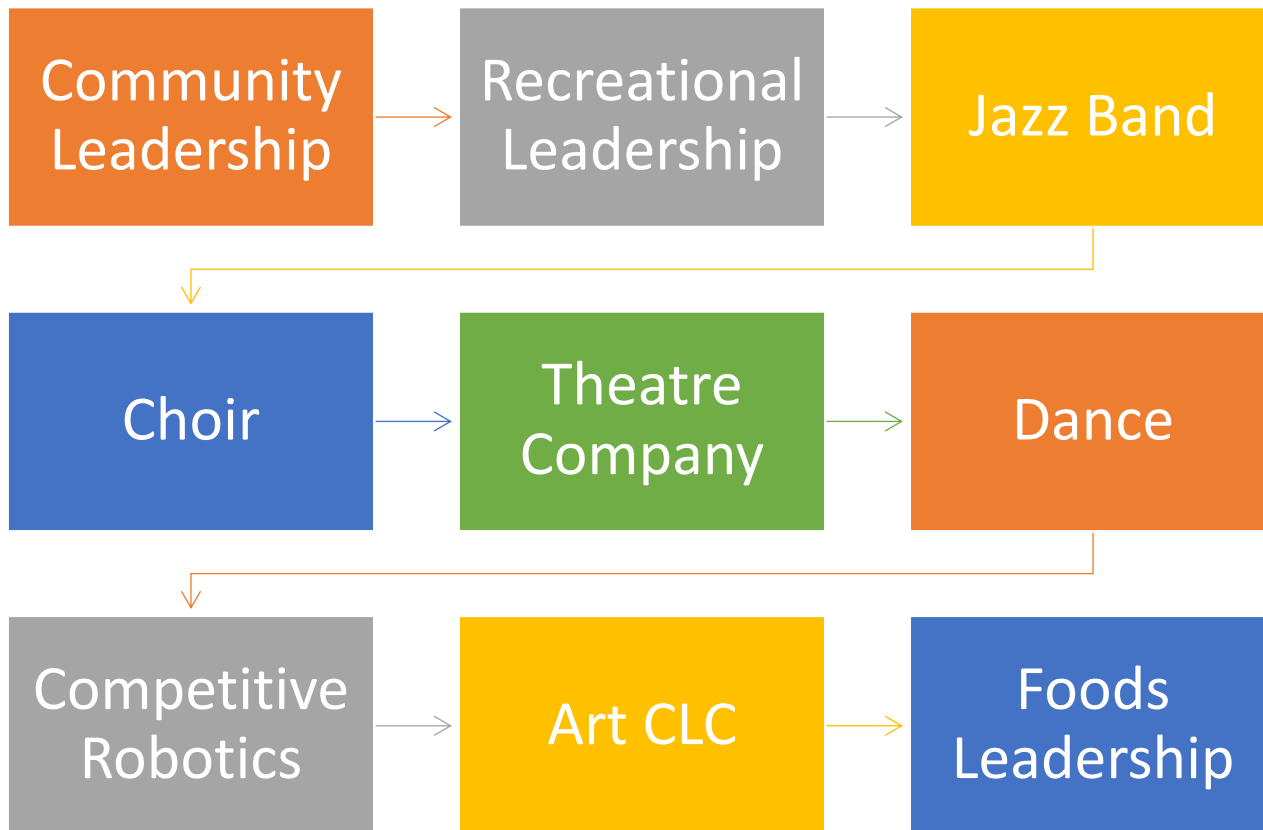
Career Life Education (Typically taken in Grade 10)


