



Applying to Post-Secondary Institutions

<https://www.educationplannerbc.ca> is an online application that makes it easier for you to apply for admission to two or more schools by saving key applicant information. It is the online application for admission service for 25 public post-secondary institutions in BC. This website also has information about admission requirements for post-secondary institutions.

When do I apply? What are the deadlines?

- Kwantlen: accepts applications beginning **October 1st 2020** – closes either **March 1** or **Aug 1**
- UBC: application deadline is **January 15** (Early offers and scholarship deadline is **December 1**)
- SFU: application deadline is **January 31** (Major entrance scholarship deadline is **December 15**) at educationplannerbc.ca

Student Transcripts Service

Post-Secondary Institutions require students to arrange to have interim and final transcripts sent to them in the spring and summer. Student Transcripts Service (STS) is an online application for students to view their school marks, scholarships and transcript, and send transcripts electronically to Post Secondary Institutes (you can send transcripts up to 25 institutions for free). | | <p>No matter what degree you are applying to, UBC will broadly evaluate your academic history by looking at your grades in all academic Grade 11 (junior level) and Grade 12 (senior level) courses. This does not include applied design, skills, and technologies courses; career education courses; physical and health education courses; or faith-based courses.</p> <p>The degree that you apply to will determine which courses UBC evaluates. UBC will look at your grades from all the academic Grade 11 (junior level) and Grade 12 (senior level) courses that fall under <u>subject categories</u> related to the degree you applied to at UBC. If you present a course at both Grade 11 (junior) and Grade 12 (senior) levels, UBC will focus on the higher level only.</p> | |



Admission Requirements 2020/2021

UBC:

- All grade 11 & 12 courses will be counted in average (12-18 required) – applied skills & Technology, PE and Career courses do not count
- All programs require a minimum 70% average in English 11 or 12
- No more approved courses list BUT at least **SIX** academic/non-academic Grade 12 courses (recommended, but not required).
- MUST give UBC permission from STS (student Transcript service) – no grade self report
- All courses including on-line courses need to be completed by **June 30, 2021**
- Specific programs have specific admission requirements

SFU:

- GPA must be very high to be competitive, 80% through 90%
- All programs require a minimum final grade of 70% in English 12
- Admission average calculated on English 12 and **FOUR** additional approved grade 12 courses with more emphasis on courses from List 'A'
- Online courses need to be completed by **June 30, 2021**.
- Specific programs have specific admission requirements
- Admission is based on an evaluation of all approved Grade 11 and 12 courses, with greater emphasis on List A courses

Kwantlen:

- A minimum grade of 'C+' (67%) in English 12
- Specific programs have specific admission requirements
 - Example: Health Foundations (Nursing) application is open from Oct. 1st and closes Nov. 1st for the Fall 2021 intake
- Deadline for early application and limited intake programs is **March 1st, 2021**.
- Final application deadline is **August 1st, 2021**.

UVIC:

- GPA must be high to be competitive: varies by faculty program and year
- Completion of Grade 12 English (or its equivalent) in a Canadian curriculum with a grade of 86% or higher.
- Specific programs have specific admission requirements
- Application deadline is **January 31, 2021**.



StudentTranscripts Service

Information For Students

StudentTranscripts Service (STS) is an online application for students to view their school marks, transcripts, scholarships and send transcripts electronically to post secondary institutions and employers.



Get Started

To register for STS students will need:

- Personal Education Number (PEN)
- Full legal name
- Date of birth
- Email address

Step 1 Go to the Ministry of Education's **Transcripts and Certificate website** at <http://www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca>.

Step 2 You **must sign up** for a BCeID before you can use the StudentTranscripts Service. For BCeID signup, you need to:

- Complete the fields to register for a basic BCeID
- Select your password reset questions and answers (*remember these* as you will need them if you forget your password)
- Follow the system prompts and sign up for StudentTranscripts Service.

Sign Up for a BCeID

Step 3 Log-in to StudentTranscripts Service using your BCeID.

When registering for the Student Transcript Service using your BCeID, you will be prompted to:

- Enter your student information used by your school (see **Get Started** information above)
- Read the personal data collection info and complete the process by clicking "submit"
- An email will be sent to the email address provided and must be activated within 24 hours of receipt or you will need to complete the registration process again
- Once activated, you will be able to log onto STS using your BCeID and password.

Step 4 From your STS Dashboard, you can choose your post-secondary institutions (PSIs) selections, preview, send and order transcripts, view exam and assessment results and view scholarship information. Please note that all transcripts previewed in the STS are considered unofficial, but official transcripts will be sent out when ordered.

You will need to consent to the STS privacy notice which enables the ministry to send your transcripts to your selected PSIs by paper or electronically depending on how the PSI is able to receive transcripts. Printed copies of transcripts may take up to 3 weeks for processing and delivery to your selected PSIs.
