Dogwood Diploma - at a glance

The B.C. Certificate of Graduation or "Dogwood Diploma" is awarded to students who successfully complete the provincial graduation requirements.

Students require a minimum of **80 credits** to graduate.

Of these 80 credits:

- At least 16 credits must be at the Grade 12 level, including a required Language Arts 12 and Career Life Connections
- At least 28 credits must be elective course credits
- Effective July 1, 2023: At least 4 credits must have an Indigenous-focus (see <u>Indigenous-Focused Graduation Requirements - Province of British Columbia (gov.bc.ca)</u> for additional information)
- 52 credits are required from the following:
 - Career-Life Education (4 credits), and Career-Life Connections (4 credits)
 - Physical and Health Education 10 (4 credits)
 - Science 10 (4 credits), and a Science 11 or 12 (4 credits)
 - Social Studies 10 (4 credits), and a Social Studies 11 or 12 (4 credits)
 - A Math 10 (4 credits), and a Math 11 or 12 (4 credits)
 - A Language Arts 10, 11 and a required 12 (12 credits total)
 - An Arts Education 10, 11, or 12 and/or an Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies 10, 11, or 12 (4 credits total)







GRADUATION CODE OF CONDUCT

Johnston Heights Secondary – Graduation Code of Conduct 2025-2026

At Johnston Heights, we believe in celebrating our students' achievements through meaningful graduation events. Participation in graduation activities is a privilege, and students are expected to uphold the values and expectations of our school community throughout their Grade 12 year.

To attend graduation-related events, students must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Students must be in good academic standing and not on Academic Probation.
- Students are expected to follow the school's Code of Conduct throughout the year. This includes appropriate behavior, attendance, punctuality and disruptive actions.
- Grad Pranks are strictly prohibited police will be called for any student who participates in grad pranks.
- 4. All school rules remain in effect during graduation activities. The following are strictly prohibited:
 - Possession or consumption of alcohol
 - Possession or use of drugs
 - Disrespectful behavior toward school staff or venue personnel
 - Leaving the designated event area (re-entry will not be permitted)
- Students who violate any rules will be asked to leave the event. Parents/guardians will be notified, and no refunds will be issued.

To participate in graduation events, both the student and their parent/guardian must sign this agreement. By signing, you confirm that you understand and agree to follow Johnston Heights Secondary's Code of Conduct throughout the Grade 12 year.

This is the personalized comment read aloud as each student crosses the stage.


The online form is due by **April 16** and includes a section for phonetic spelling of the student's name to ensure correct pronunciation.
