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## **COVID-19 Letter and Reminders**

Last Wednesday, the Hazelgrove community was issued its first COVI-19 exposure letter. We received several emails and phone calls from concerned parents asking, "Why did it take so long to receive these letters?". School do not initiate this process. Schools pass the appropriate information on to families immediately when it is received from Fraser Health. With the surge in COVID cases, Fraser Health is working hard to process and respond to cases as quickly as they can. While receiving an exposure letter can be alarming, it is important to remember that this does not necessarily mean that students and / or teachers were exposed. As well, <u>Dr. Bonnie Henry has shared that</u>, overall, schools are doing a good job of curbing COVID-19 exposures.
