PRE-REQUISITES

- Registered in a Surrey public school and not yet achieved Ministry of Education graduation
- Expected to meet Emily Carr University academic admission requirements
- A recommended "C" or better in an English Language Arts 11 or 12
- Have taken or are enrolled in two other
 Grade 11 or Grade 12 academic courses
- Have taken or are enrolled in two Grade 11 or Grade 12 electives (Art 11 or 12 courses recommended)

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- Have a discussion with your Career
 Facilitator, counsellor and parent/guardian
 to ensure the program meets your goals
- Obtain the specific Emily Carr Headstart in Art application package from your Career Centre
- Submit a completed application package with all three appendices and supporting documents, which includes your high school transcript, to your Career Facilitator before the specified due date
- Visit teens.ecuad.ca to learn more about the Headstart in Art Program

SELECTION PROCESS

- Students who submit completed applications will have a preliminary interview with their school Career Facilitator
- Applications are forwarded to the district office for review
- Only qualified applicants will have their applications forwarded in the order received for a potential seat in the program
- Be on-track to meet the acceptance criteria for the post-secondary institute
- Students must meet all criteria, be selfmotivated, independent learners and capable of success in the program

JOB DESCRIPTION

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This course introduces students to the methods, materials and concepts of drawing, both as a visual language and as a tool for enhancing perceptual awareness. While investigating process and developing a critical vocabulary, students will begin to acquire the skills to translate immediate observation and ideas into 2-dimensional form. In-class projects and assignments will encompass various aspects of drawing, while visual presentations and class discussion will introduce students to contemporary and historical ideas of art and design.
