Principal's Report

NSS Website/App... all updates are posted to the NSS website and NSS Spartans school app. The NSS website has a review of the school announcements posted every day.

Communication... Students/Parents have the option to use the website and app for the most up to date information around the school. Parents can also call into the office for student absences. The best option for reaching a teacher directly is via email. All teacher emails are posted on the website.

Dates ... All important dates are posted on the NSS website and NSS app.

Athletic teams & Clubs... Upcoming information on sports teams/tryouts and various school clubs are done with daily announcements and posted on the TV screens throughout the school every day.

Course Selection... Course selection and planning for all grades has begun. Information is posted on the NSS website. This year the students are choosing their courses online on MyEd. Students will start their selections in March and can make changes before the end of the current year.

Crosswalk Safety... Student safety is still a concern while they are crossing at the crosswalk. Modifications to the fence are being done to lower 5 of the fence panels to increase driver's visibility around the crosswalk. Educating students on crosswalk safety is still a priority within the school – ensuring students are aware of their surroundings and making visual eye contact with drivers while using the crosswalk.

Report cards... are will be available on My Ed BC portal for the fall term November 20. There will be no printed report cards sent home with students. The report cards will only be available to view until the next report card is uploaded to My ED. Each student's report card should be downloaded to keep on file. *The end of year report card is only available for 3 weeks until the next school calendar year begins.

1st Semester Completion... January 24th & 25th are course completion days – these will be flex days for students who need to complete final quizzes/tests/assignments. If the student has completed all work in all courses they can take this day to prep for the next semester. The school remains open and all buses will be running. Semester 2 schedule will be handed out January 22.

What are District Partnership Programs?

- These programs are excellent opportunities for students to get a head start in their formal trades training.
- Seats are limited and students must undergo a successful application and interview to secure a seat.
- District programs are in partnership with post-secondary institutions such as KPU, BCIT, and VCC.
- Students will receive both high school and post-secondary credits while completing a District Program.
- For many programs, first year tuition is paid for by the Surrey School District – you save hundred of dollars!
- Students are responsible for purchasing books, steel-toed boots, tools, hairdressing kit, and any required post-secondary registration fees.





- Interested students should come to these information sessions to learn more about the various programs and the application process.


Overview of Career Education 8 - 12



New Career Education Course

CLC – Career Life Connections (gr. 11 or 12)

Required for graduation



What is CLC?

- CLC is a new career education course for students in grades 11 or 12, it takes the place of Grad Transitions and is **a requirement for graduation.**
- CLC culminates in the **Capstone Project** where students will showcase current accomplishments and plans for the future.
- CLC encourages community-based learning by facilitating community networking, preparing for real-life contexts and exploring experiences outside the school environment.
- Students are required to participate in 30 hours of “Career Explorations” outside of their time table as either volunteer or paid work experience.

CLC – Career Life Connections (gr. 11 or 12)

New Course, New Delivery Model, replaces Grad Transitions

Students take this course in grade 11 second semester, OR grade 12 first semester

Stand Alone Course

- 4 credits
- Counts as one class
- Can pick a passion area focus
 - Bus. Ed/Info Tech CLC
 - Performing Arts Band CLC
 - Band CLC
- Or just CLC – no specific passion

Combined Course

- 8 credits (CLC + Focus Course)
- counts as 2 blocks
- same teacher for back to back blocks
- Gr. 11 option
 - Socials Focus
- Gr. 12 options
 - Leadership Focus
 - Anatomy and Physiology Focus

Elements of Career Life Connections

- Capstone Project and Presentation
- 30 hours of Volunteer or Work Experience
- MyBluePrint, WorksafeBC, EducationPlannerBC
- Personal Development, Connections to Community, Life and Career Paths
- Resume, Cover Letter & Interview Skills
- Scholarships & Post Secondary Information
