VALENTINE'S DAY

Valentine's Day is always a fun time for kids at school. Many teachers focus on friendship and all of the social-emotional learning that is related: what is a friend? How to make friends... how to keep a friend... how to nurture friendships, and kind behaviour. These conversations and lessons are always ongoing throughout the year at developmentally appropriate levels. The issues that arise in grade 6 and 7, for example, are vastly different than those in grade 1 and 2.

This year, with Covid-19 still prominent, we are limited to how we can celebrate Valentine's Day in classes. These are the school district issued protocols we must abide by this year:

- Student/staff exchange of paper cards can occur
- Paper crafts (students using own scissors, glue, colouring supplies) can occur
- A theme day can occur. On Friday, February 12th it is Red and Pink Day at Prince Charles!
- Sharing of food of any kind **cannot** occur on an individual or communal basis. This includes sharing of chocolates, cupcakes, candy, treats that come with Valentine's Day cards, treats that are prepackaged and are individually wrapped)
- Exchange of items wrapped in plastic or made of plastic, such as treat wrappers or plastic bags **cannot** occur.

Hopefully next year, celebrations will look a lot different in schools, but for now, these are the guidelines we must follow.

DROP OFF AND PICKUP

Parents, please keep our students safe during drop off and pickup. Some ongoing issues include:

- Parents dropping off, picking up and/or idling in the transit zone.
- Parents doing u-turns east on 100th Avenue, potentially endangering pedestrians on the sidewalk and cyclists in the bike lane
- Parking in the bike lane/on the sidewalk on the south side of 100th Avenue (not allowed).
- Speeding in a school zone The speed limit is 30 km per hour on 100th Avenue 8:00 am

 5pm on school days
- Parents ignoring cones and driving into the staff parking lot to park and/or drop off or pickup

Remember that this year, we have a staggered arrival time; your child(ren) may arrive between 8:30 – 8:45 am and will not be considered late.

If the weather is pleasant, and you are not on your way to and from work, please try to walk. That time together with your child can elicit wonderful conversations and also be much less stressful when you're not worried about finding a parking spot. Thanks everyone!




