Dear Parents/Guardians,

As we approach summer break the Surrey RCMP and Surrey Schools would like to update you on some of the programs and services available for youth and parents. During the 2017/2018 school year RCMP officers had the chance to visit every school in Surrey - from primary class visits, to career fairs in high schools, to lunch-time and after school sports programs. Connecting with your children is the highlight of the RCMP's work.

This year the Surrey Gang Enforcement Team (SGET) launched a new presentation on the dangers of drugs and gangs called Shattering the Image <https://bit.ly/2MuQPo2>. This presentation speaks to the current gang landscape in Surrey and is tailored to specific audiences: elementary or high-school students, educators and parents. This program has been well received and will be continued for the next school year.

We know these are concerning topics. Understanding the warning signs that your child may be heading down the wrong path early on is key. The Surrey RCMP Parent Helpline (604-599-7800) is available to families all year and connects parents with specialized support from RCMP youth officers and counsellors. We urge you to reach out if you have questions or concerns. Some warning signs you should look for include:

- Sudden changes in behaviour, withdrawal from family
- Multiple cell phones (used for dial-a-doping)
- Large amount of cash in smaller denominations
- Secretive about activities or friendships

Above all, being invested and involved in your child's life is of the utmost importance. Know their friends, be a positive role model, and fill their time with positive activities. The City of Surrey <https://www.surrey.ca/culture-recreation/1702.aspx> has many recreational programs over the summer that can help keep all ages engaged through the summer months.

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LEADERSHIP IN LEARNING

It has been our privilege getting to know your children this year. Our School Liaison Officers handed out “high-fives” during over 1200 Hi-5 visits to schools, and close to 300 Code Blue and Mini Blue sports sessions.
