## **Grounds Update**

#### The Pergola is approved for use!

After many months of waiting for district approval, city permits and builders to craft a beautiful and sturdy structure, we can officially announce the completion of the Pergola (Outdoor Learning Classroom). We will host the first official use of the pergola at the PAC AGM on June 19. During the summer, we will add learning tables and benches to make the space useable in the 2019/20 school year! Yay!







#### Gardens

We received a garden grant to purchase six self-watering raised beds. They took some time to prepare: they have wicking material in the bottom that will pull water up from the reservoir into the soil and potentially keep plants watered for one month! We planted the beds last week with bedding plants so we can have something to harvest this year and produce to look forward to in the fall.

I will post a **summer garden sign up** for parents and their children to choose one week during the summer to maintain the gardens and partake in the garden bounty. We ask that you take only what your family could use and keep lots left for others to enjoy.

#### Wetland water containment system

Mr. Baldry has designed and constructed an amazing water containment system that will water the plants and the ponds in the wetland. Please ensure that your children do not climb onto the structure.

## **After School Play Etiquette**

We are so happy that our families spend time after school with their children to enjoy our beautiful outdoor spaces. We do ask that parents supervise their children to ensure that our **equipment is maintained and put away** so that we can all enjoy them the next day and to ensure that grounds maintenance do not have to work around materials left in the field. We also ask that children play at the **large loose parts** area **only during instructional time** for safety







## **Parking Lot**

The school district sent a parking consultant to look at our traffic situation after school on Monday. I suggested to him that we get the word "School" printed on the road where the school zone sign is. Ecole Martha Currie, which is north on 184<sup>th</sup> street, has these signs painted on the road and I notice cars slowing down there. I also said it would be good to get Entrance and Exit signs for the parking lot. The consultant said he would look into both of these things. Remember to **enter from 28<sup>th</sup>** avenue and **exit onto 184<sup>th</sup>** street. Parents have noticed that some cars are parked quite far away from others. Please **park close to other cars** so more cars can fit in. Consider carpooling as we will have more cars here next year.
