WHAT'S OUT THERE?

Use EducationPlannerBC's <u>Program Search</u> to find different programs here in BC. Search and focus by subject, location, length of time, or try different keywords or filters.

WHAT FITS YOU?

Compare a few different post-secondary institutions and programs. Do they fit with your career goals, the time you have, and how much you can afford? Many programs offer laddering or transfer opportunities - meaning where you start is not always where you finish.

KNOW YOUR INSTITUTION'S ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS.

Each institution has its own rules on how you can be part of their school, called General Institution Admission Requirements. Know them. Meet them.

APPLY ONLINE

Create one account and apply to multiple post - secondary institutions. *Please check the Post Secondary you wish to attend to see when Applications are due.* You must check the website of the school you are interested in attending. On-line admissions open as early as mid-August so you need to research the important dates for your post-secondary institution.

As a general guideline, the (final) admission deadline for <u>universities</u> falls between December and March.

Application deadlines for BCIT and many Colleges vary by program and may extend into the spring and summer months; you must check the school's website for the specific details of your program.



Please come to the *Career Centre* located in room T202 located on the table in Career Centre to request your Official Transcript. Please allow *three days* for processing.

OR

Do you require a Unofficial Transcript for Scholarship Applications, Out of Province Applications or Specialty Programs? Student Transcripts Service (STS) is an online application for students to view their school marks and send transcripts electronically.

HOW TO USE THE STUDENT TRANSCRIPT SERVICE

NEW YouTube Student Transcript Service Instructional Video

You can order your transcripts online using the Student Transcript Service.

o You may send up to 25 transcripts to post-secondary institutions at no charge

o You may send 1 transcript to a 3rd party at no charge. Additional transcripts are \$10 each.

Orders are processed in 3 – 6 business days, then sent electronically or mailed using standard Canada Post letter mail service

You will receive your graduation certificate at no charge from your school once you have met graduation requirements. You can also order copies online using the StudentTranscripts service for \$10 each.





LTSS COMMENCEMENT UPDATES!

DATE: Wednesday, June 23rd in our school gym (~9am - 4pm).

ARRIVAL: Each group will be given a specific time to attend their mini ceremony. Assigned times will be shared with students and posted on the school website and app with detailed instructions the week prior.

SAFETY: Masks must be worn by all when inside the school, as per the PHO. Social distancing must also be maintained at all times.

PHOTOS: Artona will take commemorative photos of the graduates prior to crossing the Red Carpet. These photos will be available to families after the event.

THE PLAN: After getting their individual photos, in alphabetical order, grads will individually cross the red carpet dressed in Cap and Gown to receive their diplomas, in the presence of the principal.

VIEWING: The event will be livestreamed and recorded. The link to the video will be sent out to families on the weekend following the event.

PARENTS: Each graduate will be given one **parking pass** so their family can come and park in our parking lot. Families will be able to watch the livestreamed event on their electronic devices from inside their cars. The parking lot will be set up in a celebratory way.

GRAD PARADE: Grads will exit the school to parade in front of the cars for celebratory honking and cheering and will toss their caps to acknowledge their achievements.

TIMING: It is very important students arrive at the school at their scheduled time. At the end of each session, students must leave promptly so the next group can begin.

GOWN DISTRIBUTION: Grad gowns will be distributed in their cohort classrooms on **Friday**, **June 18**th. At that time, grads will also receive their commencement schedule, the composite group photo, and a grad gift provided by LTSS & PAC. *LT masks will be given to each student on the day of the commencement*.

• Gowns **must** be returned upon completion of the graduation ceremony.

FAMILY TIME: Students will have their gowns, caps, and grad gifts 5 days prior to the ceremony so they can take photos and celebrate with their family and friends at their convenience.
