June 21 is National Indigenous Peoples Day. This is a day for all Canadians to recognize and celebrate the unique heritage, diverse cultures and outstanding contributions of <u>First Nations</u>, <u>Inuit</u> and <u>Métis</u> peoples. The Canadian Constitution recognizes these three groups as Aboriginal peoples, also known as Indigenous peoples. Although these groups share many similarities, they each have their own distinct heritage, language, cultural practices and spiritual beliefs.

In cooperation with Indigenous organizations, the Government of Canada chose June 21, the summer solstice, for National Aboriginal Day, now known as National Indigenous Peoples Day. For generations, many <u>Indigenous peoples and communities</u> have celebrated their culture and heritage on or near this day due to the significance of the summer solstice as the longest day of the year.

Class Placement for 2021-2022

On the first day of school, students will return to their previous classroom and teacher.

This allows students to check in with their previous teacher, return to a familiar place, and know where they will be on their first day. It can help calm any nerves students may be feeling on their first day back.

Students will then be placed in temporary groupings, rotating to two or three different teachers over the next week. Please plan to send basic supplies (e.g. pencil case and materials) during this first week. We appreciate this rotation can be upsetting for students as they are eager to know their teacher and who is in their class. However, ensuring we have balanced classes, positive peer connections (and not distractions), and take time to consider complex emotional, social and intellectual strengths and needs of children is worth the first several days of the school year. Thank you for your support and understanding.

Parent/guardian requests for a particular teacher or student pairing will not be part of the criteria used in balancing classes. However, please feel free to provide the school with information that can assist in the placement of your child. This information is not about a specific request; rather, it can be about your child's personal, educational or emotional needs that will assist us in helping your child have a successful year of learning and growth.

B.C. gov't anticipates 'near-normal return' for students in September

Thursday, June 17, 2021

Full-time in-class instruction and the elimination of cohorts are on the horizon for the 2021-22 school year as <u>the Ministry of Education announced Thursday an anticipated "near-normal return"</u> to school life for students, parents, teachers and staff in September with its <u>K-12 Recovery Plan</u>.

"Our students, parents and staff have waited a long time for this moment, and we are excited to see a return to a more normal way of life in our classrooms, our schools and our communities," said Surrey Board of Education Chair Laurie Larsen. "It is because of their hard work, effort and vigilance throughout the past year that the province is able to make this announcement today, and we thank you for your dedication to the health and safety of everyone in our schools."

As the B.C. Restart Plan continues to unfold amid high vaccination rates and low school-based transmissions, the provincial government announced that students across the province can expect to learn in classrooms full time and no longer be grouped into cohorts.

Guidance on mask usage in school settings will be determined later this summer, in alignment with broader provincial direction for the fall and winter. Students will still be required to practice frequent hand hygiene, complete <u>daily health</u> <u>checks</u> and stay home if they are feeling sick. Public health teams and school health officers will continue to monitor and track COVID-19 cases in schools and the community, and provide support and guidance with the return in the fall.


In the summer, the provincial K-12 education steering committee, the Ministry and the BC Centre for Disease Control (BCCDC) will review and finalize school safety plans for the fall. The current Provincial COVID-19 Health & Safety Guidelines for K-12 Settings will be replaced by updated guidelines in August.
