Staffing and Student Class Placement for 2021/2022

At this time, staffing plans and preliminary class assignments are tentatively organized. These are DRAFT plans only, because the September enrollment is the final determination of classes and student placement. If you are planning to move to another school in September, please let the office staff know. From time to time, parents want to request specific placement for their child/ren for the upcoming year. It is important to understand that the placement of students is determined through a process of consultation with all school-based staff who work with the students – not just the classroom teacher. We work carefully and collaboratively to determine the most suitable placement of your child based on the following criteria:

- Intellectual, social and emotional development
- Learning styles and strengths
- Degree of independence
- Integration of students with special needs
- Social compatibility
- Gender balance
- Class size and composition requirements
- Parameters of the school organization (e.g. # of classes, combined grades)

If you have educational concerns regarding the placement of your child, please put it in writing to Mr. Redding. We want a suitable class placement for all children, and it is not appropriate to request a specific teacher or with particular friends. While we understand that there are varying opinions on combined grade classes, it is important to understand that even in a single class there is a range of student strengths and abilities. Teachers are well qualified to teach both grades in a combined class. Please know that although parental requests are considered, we do not guarantee any parental request for a child's class placement next year.

On Wednesday, students will be placed in temporary grade groupings which will continue until classes are set. We will work as quickly as possible to form classes. This could take a week or longer. We ask for your patience and understanding as we wade through the complex process of placing students. Staff are committed to organizing classes which are balanced in terms of student performance and behavioral characteristics.
