At the Provincial Track and Field Championship last weekend, Salish came away with 5 medals. Lindsay and Ryan Cyr both won first place in the province by winning their shot put events. They both not only won, but set new personal bests at the meet. Rachel Woods won medals in both of her events, the 400m and 800m races. Emma Kearns also made it to the finals in the hurdles and earned 7<sup>th</sup> place.
