#### The Importance of Summer Routines

We are all looking forward to the summer and wish you and your families the very best over the break. This is an opportune time to continue your child's learning without the confines of a school building. We believe that summer can be a more relaxed time but not a time where a child should feel that their learning has stopped. For growing children the amount of sleep that is recommended is between 8 and 10 hours and staying up late regularly has negative physical and mental implications for their development.



Although routines will loosen over the summer, we do recommend that your child still follow a schedule, which will allow them to keep regularity in their environment. Keeping a 'Shape of the Day' on your fridge is just one example of helping your child know what is happening that day. It becomes very difficult for children to switch from total freedom to the rigors of a school schedule; so in order for children to ease back and forth between the two we recommend that they continue to write journals, to read for pleasure and to have fulsome family discussions mixed with their play and vacation time.



Summer is the perfect time for families and friends to reconnect and to have flexibility in children's schedules. We encourage that they do this within the umbrella of continuing their learning and physical activity. In doing this, try and limit screen time and enjoy the outdoors. Focus on interactive social connections and less on social media. All of this will lead to an easy transition back to school.

Dear Parents/Guardians;

Each school year, parents support their child(ren)'s formal learning experiences in a wide variety of ways. We so appreciate all that you do to ensure a successful year!

In addition to providing the school supplies itemized on a grade list, parents are periodically asked for monies to cover specific items and/or special events. No student will be denied the opportunity to participate in any school activity due to the inability to pay. Please contact the Principal should you require any financial assistance.

As we plan for the 2019-2020 school year, we anticipate the following costs:

**Student Planner:** We encourage all students in Grades 1-7 to purchase a School Planner at a cost of \$5.00. Included in the planner is our school code of conduct, school calendar and school district information. We find this to be an excellent tool for facilitating home/school communication, as well as for developing our students' organizational skills. However, using our school planner is optional as a parent may purchase their own version.

**Intensive Fine Arts Program:** If your children are registered in this program, there is a yearly fee of \$40 required by September 27, 2019.

**School Start pre-packaged school supply service:** Parents have the option of purchasing their child's school supplies on their own utilizing the grade supply list, or for your convenience you may wish to purchase supplies as a package through School Start. Payment is made directly to School Start. Costs for supplies vary based on grade. Supply lists have been sent home with students, and can also be ordered on line.


**Field Studies and Field Trips:** Classes often enjoy educational visits to community facilities which extend and enhance the curriculum. While we use school monies or fundraise to cover the costs of such activities wherever possible, there are times when parents are asked to contribute towards the cost of the trip or in-school activities. If you choose to have your child not participate in a field study or activity, a suitable program will be provided at the school.

**Musical Instruments:** Grade 4 and 5 students may learn to play the recorder. Students will have the option of purchasing one through our music teacher for \$8.00 or receiving one on loan from the school. Also, our Grade 7 students who opt for/take band either purchase or rent an instrument. Costs vary depending on the instrument.
