

Humanities 8 – Course Outline

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Objectives:

In Humanities, we combine Social Studies and English to provide opportunities for students to better understand the world around them while improving their ability to communicate using the English language. By integrating the concepts of English with those of Social Studies, both subject areas are enhanced leading to a greater understanding and appreciation of each. This course will encourage you to develop your capacity to be an independent learner while you actively participate in a variety of learning opportunities, focusing on critical thinking skills, reading and writing skills, creative problem solving, and cooperative learning.
