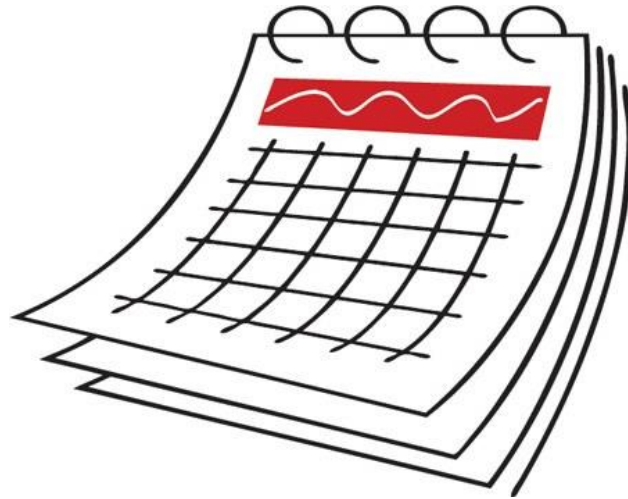

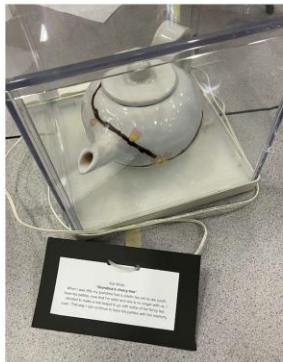

Pink Shirt Day

February 28, 2024



Did You Know?

- The global movement of Pink Shirt Day traces back to 2007 in Berwick, Nova Scotia, a small Canadian town with a population of 2,500.
- After a new student at their school was bullied for wearing a pink shirt, two Grade 12 students -- David Shepherd and Travis Price -- bought 50 pink shirts and encouraged their classmates to wear pink. The next day they went to distribute the shirts and to their surprise the majority of students arrived wearing pink.
- With that act of kindness, Pink Shirt Day was born. It has since become a global movement.
- In 2022, the United Nations declared May 4 as Anti-Bullying Day. Now, the last Wednesday each February is Canada's national Pink Shirt/anti-bullying day.



Corey Bullock is an internationally recognized artist from the Haida Nation in British Columbia. The design was created in his signature graffiti style, with two gathering hands featuring a traditional Haida human form. This indicates the welcoming and respect of others and serves as a friendly greeting which is used throughout Coast British communities, with similar gestures used throughout communities in the Northwest Coast.

The Pink Shirt Day campaign recognizes the importance of unity, inclusivity, and diversity of all people.

Traffic Safety



Traffic safety around Lord Tweedsmuir Secondary is a critical priority for our community. With increased enrollment, the number of vehicles navigating around and within our school grounds also increases. It is essential that all drivers are very cautious while driving near the school and are aware of the many student pedestrians who are nearby.

All students and parents/guardians are requested to consider the following:

- If possible, students - please walk and/or bike to school. Fewer vehicles attempting to drop off and/or pick up students will be very helpful.
- Consider dropping off/picking up 2-3 blocks away from the school and avoid the traffic congestion around the school.
- Consider drop-off/pick up earlier and/or later in the morning/afternoons to avoid peak traffic times.

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Philosophy

Therefore, our student recognition program is deeply rooted in the BC Core Competencies, emphasizing the development of personal and social competencies as well as the importance of communication alongside intellectual growth. Our student recognition program is also designed with the First Peoples Principles in mind and will continue to evolve in a way that values student identity and experience, and students' connectedness to the world around them. We are grateful to be able to learn and celebrate learning on the unceded territories of the q̓ic̓əy' (Katzie), q'w̓a:n̓'ən' (Kwantlen), and SEMYOME (Semiahmoo) Nations.

Course Awards

Course Awards are based on outstanding curricular achievement in a course. Note that these awards include Physical and Health Education (PE) courses but exclude Athletics (e.g. extracurricular sports teams), which are recognized separately.

ELIGIBILITY

*All students are eligible.
Criteria are determined by each subject area department but would typically include top academic students.*

HOW TO APPLY

*No application necessary.
Teachers submit candidate names for consideration based on end-of-semester or end-of-year grades.*

RECOGNITION

*Awards Ceremony (gr 8-11)
Commencement (gr 12)
Certificate of recognition*

Other Department Awards

Other Department Awards are based on criteria other than strictly curricular achievement. These can be based on achievements unique to a subject area or other general skills (e.g. grit, resilience, leadership, mentorship, growth, performance).

ELIGIBILITY

All students are eligible.

Criteria are determined by each subject area department and are unique to the knowledge and skills developed in that subject area.

HOW TO APPLY

No application necessary.

Teachers submit candidate names for consideration based on the specific criteria for the awards.

RECOGNITION

Core Competency Awards (NEW)

Core Competency Awards are based on demonstrated growth in one of the three Core Competencies, across multiple curricular and/or extracurricular areas.

Growth is in relation to a student's progress through the [Core Competency profiles](#)

ELIGIBILITY

All students are eligible to apply.

Criteria include demonstrated growth across multiple curricular and/or extracurricular areas.

HOW TO APPLY

Students can nominate themselves or be nominated by a teacher.

Candidates must submit an application to be considered. A selection committee will review applications to determine award recipients.

Details of application process to be announced in the spring of 2024.

Honour Roll

The Honour Roll is based on the achievement of earning a grade average of 73% (3.0 GPA) or higher across all courses during a school year. Grade 10-12 students are eligible for Honour Roll.

ELIGIBILITY

All students in grades 10-12 are eligible.

Students must achieve a 73% (3.0 GPA) average or higher in the current academic year.

HOW TO APPLY

No application necessary.

This award is automatically calculated based on end-of-year percentages, which are converted to a GPA.

RECOGNITION

Certificate of recognition

4.0 GPA Award (Current Year)

The 4.0 GPA Award is based on achievement of a 4.0 GPA for the current school year.
Grade 10-12 students are eligible for this award.

ELIGIBILITY

All students in grade 10-12 are eligible.

Students must achieve a 4.0 GPA during their current academic year.

HOW TO APPLY

No application necessary.

This award is automatically calculated based on end-of-year percentages, which are converted to a GPA.

RECOGNITION

Commencement (grade 12s)

Certificate of recognition

Name published on school website and in parent newsletter

4.0 GPA Award (Across All Years)

The 4.0 GPA Award is based on achievement of a 4.0 GPA across all eligible school years.

ELIGIBILITY

All students in grade 12 are eligible.

HOW TO APPLY

*No application necessary.
This award is automatically calculated based on end-of-year percentages across all grade levels where percentages were assigned. Percentages are then converted to a GPA.*

RECOGNITION

Valedictorian

The Valedictorian is a student representative of the current year's graduating class. They have the honour of speaking on behalf of the graduating class at the commencement ceremony as well as grad dinner/dance.

ELIGIBILITY

All grade 12 students are eligible to apply.

Eligibility is also based on outstanding curricular and extracurricular achievement as well as the candidate's suitability to be a representative of the current year's graduating class.

HOW TO APPLY

Candidates must submit an application to be considered.

The final decision will be based on consideration of a student vote and the discretion of the selection committee.

Communication of Student Learning (March)

Early Intervention Week (March 4-8)

Early Intervention Week is dedicated time for teachers to communicate informally with families about their child's progress in relation to the learning standards of their classes. All families should expect to receive some form of communication about their child (e.g. phone call, student self-assessment signed off on by the teacher, email, parent-teacher conference).

If your child's teacher has concerns about their progress, either due to insufficient evidence of learning (i.e. they are missing work, have not engaged in significant curricular activities) or insufficient understanding (i.e. they are not on track to demonstrating sufficient understanding of the learning standards by the end of the course), they may be issued an *Insufficient Evidence* form, which outlines the nature of the concerns and includes an action plan for how to get your child back on track.

If you have any questions about your child's progress, please contact their teachers.

The online appointment booking system will open for parents to book appointments on Friday, March 1st and close on Wednesday, March 6th at midnight.

March - Spring Health for Kids

The spring season is approaching which means warmer weather and more outdoor activities. It's also an opportunity to foster new healthy habits for our children. Here are five practical tips for school-aged kids to make the most of this season.

Get active

Warmer weather makes spring the perfect time to get outside and play. Take a walk around your neighbourhood or head to a local park or hiking trail. You can also stay active close to home with some backyard jump rope or hopscotch.

Think fresh

Springtime often brings up images of fresh fruits and produce. Now is a great time to teach children about where food comes by helping them to start their own home garden. You don't need a large space to get started. Strawberries, tomatoes and lettuce can all be grown from pots on a sundeck.

Be sun safe

Sun burns are possible even in spring. Use a sunscreen that has Sun Protection Factor (SPF) 30 or more. When possible, schedule outdoor activities in the morning or late afternoon and early evening. If you and your children are out in the sun during mid-day hours, wear long sleeves, loose-fitting long pants and a hat with a wide brim.
