### Healthy Schools May – Mental Health And Youth Substance Use

#### Mental health and substance use impacts on youth

Youth is a time of growing, learning and changing. It can also be a time when behaviours may become more risky and youth may experiment with substance use. Alcohol, vapour products and cannabis are the most common substances used by youth.

Cannabis, alcohol and the nicotine found in vaping products, can have negative impacts on the way a child or youth's brain grows and develops. This puts youth who use substances at increased risk of mental health issues, such as depression, anxiety and psychosis. Helping youth to avoid or delay substance use for as long as possible can help protect their mental health and brain development.

For youth who are already using substances, the earlier we help the better. Here are some tips to help you support your child or youth:

- Start by having open and honest conversations. Avoid lecturing or judgements.
- Seek out factual information to share with your children.
- If you use alcohol or other substances, pay attention to when, why and how much you use. Have conversations with your children about how they feel about your alcohol or substance use.
- Encourage youth to delay the decision to use alcohol and other substances. Have conversations with them to see if they are thinking about trying alcohol or other substances. If they are, ask if they could wait one year? Then, a year later, maybe ask if they could wait another year.
- Let youth know that not everyone chooses to use alcohol or substances. Alcohol is carcinogenic and contributes to significant health and social harm.
- Have clear, but caring boundaries and family guidelines about alcohol and substance use. Ensure your child feels safe and supported. For example, let them know you will be there for them to provide a safe ride home for them or their friends if they need one. ### **Important information about Summer Learning (Summer School):**

Important information about Summer Learning (Summer School):

Registration is now OPEN. Although the school year is not yet over, some families may wish to register early for Summer Learning. Here is some information you should be aware of prior to registering your child for Summer Learning courses:

- Spaces fill fast; the deadline to register is June 23rd
- Not all courses are offered in Summer Learning See the Summer Learning website<sup>3</sup> for more information about courses that are offered.
- Summer Learning is free for BC residents (only international students or students from out-ofprovince are required to pay fees).
- Parents/caregivers can expect confirmation of registration to be sent via email within a few days of registering
- Remedial courses are now called "**Preview/Review**". These courses give students an opportunity to receive credit for a course for which they were not previously successful in.

To be eligible for a Preview/Review course, the student must have already taken the course. Students who are looking to upgrade their mark should repeat the full course at their usual school the following year, or enroll in the full-credit course in Summer Learning.

With Ms. Sampson-Bouge's guidance, students beaded lanyards to reflect their personal, artistic vision and we are proud of their efforts. Ms. Sampson-Bouge offered us Teachings she learned from beading with her Grandmother while sharing her

PSST is a unique, innovative website designed by Surrey Schools in partnership with the Surrey RCMP. The website is geared towards ensuring the safety and security of Surrey students and their schools. Features include an on-line "REPORT IT" tip box which allows students to anonymously report dangerous or illegal activity such as bullying, vandalism, drugs, or other issues happening at their schools or in their community.

In addition to safety related issues, the site provides resources and links to community websites on topics such as bullying, drugs, self-harm, online safety, discrimination, and gangs.

The PSST site has been continuously updated with input directly from students in Surrey through schoolbased groups. All topics, design and stories shared on the site were developed in coordination with secondary school students.
