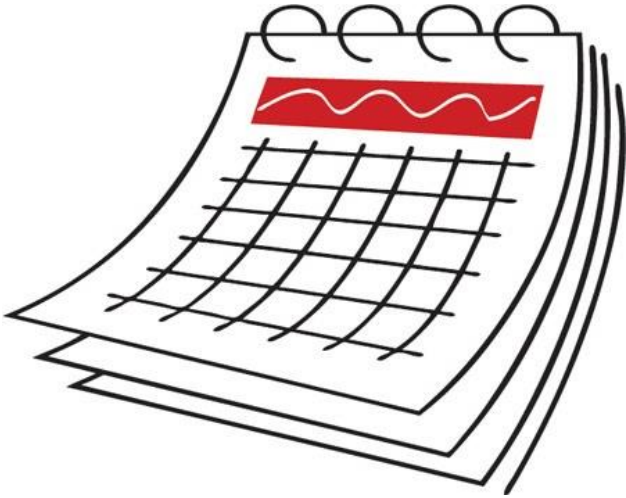

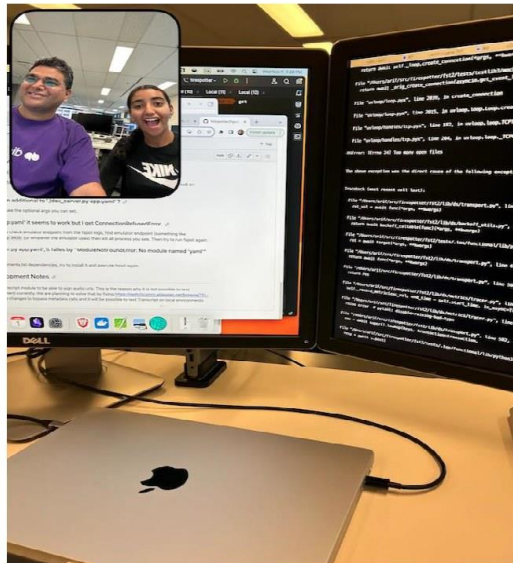

Traffic Safety





Traffic safety around Lord Tweedsmuir Secondary is a critical priority for our community. With increased enrollment, the number of vehicles navigating around and within our school grounds also increases. It is essential that all drivers are very cautious while driving near the school and are aware of the many student pedestrians who are nearby.

All students and parents/guardians are requested to consider the following:

- If possible, students - please walk and/or bike to school. Fewer vehicles attempting to drop off and/or pick up students will be very helpful.
- Consider dropping off/picking up 2-3 blocks away from the school and avoid the traffic congestion around the school.
- Consider drop-off/pick up earlier and/or later in the morning/afternoons to avoid peak traffic times.

Communicating Student Learning: Changes to K-12 Reporting

As mentioned in previous newsletters, there have been some changes to the way that student learning is communicated to families.

See below for a summary of these changes and for more information about what this means for you and your child.

Information for Parents and Caregivers



K-12 Student Reporting

When you were in school, were you asked to memorize information and repeat it on a test, only to forget it soon after? We now know learning is not just memorizing – it's being able to use what we know and apply it in real-world settings. Universities, colleges, and employers today care more about how students think than how many facts they can repeat.

BC's Curriculum

The learning students do today is more complex than ever. British Columbia redesigned the provincial curriculum to respond to the needs of today's learners. The curriculum continues to give your child a strong foundation in reading, writing, and math. But it also teaches your child how to think critically, communicate, solve problems, and use their knowledge in ways that both matter in school and will matter in a rapidly changing future.

The new curriculum has been in place in all grades since 2019, but report cards and the way student learning is communicated haven't really changed for decades. Report cards are now changing to align with the curriculum and to help ensure that every student in the province is set up for success in their learning.



Classroom assessment

You may remember getting a letter grade or percentage at the end of a chapter in your textbook or after a test, signaling to you that learning had come to an end. Today we know that learning doesn't stop when students hand in an assignment or complete a test.

We also know that:

- student learning can be communicated in ways other than letter grades
- teacher feedback on student learning can help students continue to learn
- students are more engaged when they have a say in how they show their learning



That's why students will receive marks on a four-point scale from Kindergarten to Grade 9. Students in Grades 10-12 will still receive a letter grade and percentage to support their entry into post-secondary education. And reporting for all students will now include self-reflection and goal setting.

Report Cards

These changes mean that report cards might not look the same as when you were in school. But the information you will now receive will provide a complete picture of what your child can do, where they need to improve, and how you can support their learning. Reporting in this way will ensure that students focus on learning instead of competing for marks.

The Provincial Proficiency Scale

If your child is in Grades K-9, you won't see letter grades on their report card. Instead, you will see information on where your child is on the Provincial Proficiency Scale. The scale uses the terms "Emerging," "Developing," "Proficient," and "Extending" to describe student learning. The scale maintains high standards for student learning.

Emerging	Developing	Proficient	Extending
Emerging means your child is beginning to understand something in an area of learning. They are still learning but may need more support to move ahead. Emerging doesn't mean your child is unsuccessful in this area.	Developing means your child understands some things in an area of learning but still has other areas to work on. Like Emerging, it doesn't mean your child is unsuccessful in this area.	Proficient is the goal for your child. It's also the goal for all students. When your child is Proficient, it means they fully understand the required learning. But it doesn't mean their learning stops.	Extending is when students show a deeper understanding. It's when your child is able to apply their learning in new and different ways. Extending is not the goal for all students in every area of learning.

November Learning Updates (report cards)

In accordance with the provincial K-12 reporting policy³, you will be receiving an **formal Learning Update (report card)** regarding your child's progress in their courses during the month of November. As part of this reporting period, there is an early dismissal day on November 14th.

Note that if your child is in a **linear course** (course that runs year-long), they will not be receiving formal reporting for that course at this time. However, they should still receive an informal learning update from their teacher.

If your child is not yet demonstrating minimum understanding in relation to the learning standards of the course, and/or if they have not submitted adequate evidence of their learning to their teacher (e.g. missing work), they may be assigned an **Insufficient Evidence (IE)** instead of a proficiency scale indicator (gr 8-9) or letter grade (gr 10-12) to indicate that the teacher is not yet able to accurately assess their learning at this time. An action plan will also be created to help your child understand what they need to do to get back on track.

November Core Competencies Session: Goal-Setting

As part of the new K-12 reporting process, all students are now required to set goals and reflect on their progress in relation to the **Core Competencies**. For more on the Core Competencies and how parents/caregivers can support their child's development in these areas, click [HERE](#)⁵.

There will be **three** Core Competency week-long sessions throughout the year, plus an introductory session that took place in October. These sessions will take place at school, facilitated by school staff. Your child is expected to participate in all of the sessions, and is required by the Ministry of Education to complete their Core Competency goal setting and reflection exercises.

This month, they will be **setting goals** in relation to the Core Competencies. We encourage students to share these goals with their parents so that they may also support their development of these skills at home.

When your child receives their formal Learning Update (report cards) this month, there will be instructions on how you can view their Core Competencies goal-setting assignment using their SurreySchools email. If your child needs their SurreySchools login information, or password reset, they can contact any of their teachers. If you and your child still have difficulty accessing their SurreySchools email, please contact the school office.

We want to encourage parents to first **email** the school at any time to report a student absence at lordtweedsmuirabsentee@surreyschools.ca⁶. If you could please leave the date, your student's name, student number and/or date of birth along with the blocks/classes that will be missed. We are hoping this process will be an efficient way to report student absences.

If email is not an option or you wish to phone outside of office hours, you may leave a message on our voice mail box. Parents will receive an automated message at the end of each day if there are unexcused absences.

If your child is away from school due to illness please reach out to their teachers to ask for work to do from home and/or to inform them if they are able to do assigned work.

Dear Parents and Guardians:

As we settle into this new school year, the Surrey School District and the Surrey RCMP want to reaffirm our shared commitment to student safety and wellbeing. Both of our organizations are committed to supporting students and their families, and ensuring that every student has a safe, fun and productive school year.

We would also like to take this opportunity to remind parents and guardians that safety is a shared responsibility. We encourage you to talk to your child about safety and their responsibilities at home, at school and in the community. Unsafe or illegal activities have no place on or off school grounds. This includes:


- Bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, threat(s) or intimidation
- Unsafe or dangerous activities
- Violence or discrimination of any form
- Verbal, physical or sexual harassment or abuse
- Theft or vandalism
- Possession or use of intoxicating or banned substances
- Possession or use of weapons (or replica weapons like air soft or BB guns) and explosives

We know that these conversations can be difficult, but they are critical. Please reach out to your school if you need any support. We have also compiled some additional resources that you may find helpful:

- [PSST \(Protecting Surrey Schools Together\)](#): PSST (psst-bc.ca) is a district resource where school safety concerns can be reported confidentially by anyone in our school communities.
- There are a number of youth programs and initiatives to facilitate positive connections between youth, their family, school and the community, including [Code Blue/Mini Blue](#), [Project Lavender](#), [Shattering the Image](#) and the [Wrap Program](#).
- The [Surrey RCMP Parent Helpline](#) (604-599-7800) provides guidance for parents and guardians who believe their child is involved or at risk of becoming involved in criminal activity.
- The Surrey RCMP [Family & Youth Resource Support Team](#) (FYRST) works with youth when they first start to exhibit signs of poor decision-making and need to find attachment to other resources and supports.

We hope you find these resources helpful, and we encourage you to reach out to your school, the district's Safe Schools department or any of the resources above if you need any support or more information.

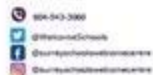

Financial Support

There are thousands of products that contain chemical ingredients which provide a "pleasant" scent. They may include the following:

2. Remember, your nose is a reliable resource to confirm it.

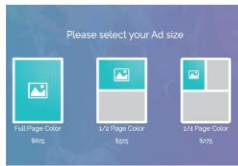



Requests side tab contains course Requests for the next school year and a Graduation Progress summary.

Membership side tab shows your child's enrollment history as well as the Schools they may be cross-enrolled to. The Programs sub side tab also displays any programs.

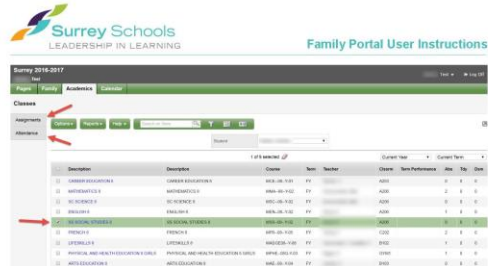
Transactions side tab may include fees information.
