
### General Admission Requirements

- Every institution has different "General Admission" requirements
- All institutions have the requirement that you must meet BC Ministry of Ed graduation requirements
- Generally, there are the 4 factors you should check
- Search the "Undergraduate Admission" section of the university website for current requirements



### Approved Courses

- Every institution has their own list of approved grade 12 courses for admission (except UBC).
- Generally, BC institutions and most other provinces calculate on 4 approved grade 12 classes (one of which is English 12) however SFU requires 5 and UBC will be looking at 6
- Always DOUBLE-CHECK the institution for their requirements
