Maple Green Logo and Mural

We are excited to share some important news with you regarding our school mascot/logo. After thoughtful consideration and collaboration with school and district staff, the PAC, and local Indigenous leaders, we have decided that after 40 years it is time for the "Gator" to retire and to change to a mascot that better reflects the rich cultural heritage and meaningful traditions of the Indigenous peoples in our community. Additionally, we want a mascot which symbolizes the characteristics Maple Green students aspire to. This change is part of our ongoing commitment to fostering an inclusive and respectful environment for all students. We believe that this new mascot will not only honour the history and contributions of Indigenous cultures but will also serve as a powerful symbol of unity and pride for our school.

We understand that change can be challenging, and we want to ensure that this transition is smooth and positive for everyone. In fact, our students and the community will be part of the process of determining our new path forward.

Our school has arranged for Katzie artist Rain Pierre to present to students about his life as an artist and he will be leading the school in an art contest to gather input from students to incorporate into an amazing mural that will be in created in our gym. Our intent is for the mural to acknowledge Maple Green's history and to take the next steps into our future.






Pink Shirt Day Feb. 26, 2025

February – Sexual health

Healthy childhood and youth development includes sexual health.

Learning about your body and its changes, health conditions, personal hygiene, healthy relationships, consent and sexuality are all part of growing up.

How do I teach my child about sex and sexuality?

It's best to start openly discussing the basics of sex, sexuality and reproduction with your child from an early age, using age-appropriate language and levels of detail. You want to establish an open and trusting relationship with your child, so they know they can come to you for advice and



accurate answers to their questions about sex and sexuality.
