Principal's Message

We continue to be so impressed and amazed at the accomplishments of our students. Our display cases are quickly filling with trophies, medals and banners from a variety of events where our Salish Wolves have participated.

Last Friday was a busy day for our Performing Arts Department. The Theatre Department hosted the District One Act Play Festival and we brought home a first place trophy. Our students worked hard and were given a berth at the regional festival at Douglas College in May. The Music Department had a very successful first showing at the Surrey Jazz Festival. Our students received much praise from the adjudicators at the festival. We were the school that earned the most awards in the region with 9 students being recognized and both our bands were accepted to the Nationals! Our dance team has been very busy competing in several competitions since January. Almost 90 dance students participated at the Breakout competition with the Grade 10/11 class receiving Gold Standard and 1st place with the highest score in their category. The Grade 8/9 class earned a Sliver standing and the Hip Hop Team placed in the top half of the competition. Congratulations to our students who choreographed and performed pieces at the district 'Big Ideas Show' that was hosted here at Salish. This past week, our dance students performed at the Pulse Dance Competition. The Senior Jazz Duo won first place and the Hip Hop Trio received 3rd place.

Congratulations to Mrs. Hermann, Mrs. Jensen, Mr. Anderson and all the Performing Art students for their award winning performances.

Wednesday night, we earned our first SSSAA banner. It is currently on display at the front entrance. Our Junior Boys Basketball team won the Championship here at home! Congratulations Wolves!

The wonderful smell of freshly baked cookies wafted down the hall on Thursday morning as our Home Economics department prepared to sell Cookies for Canuck Place during lunch. Thank you to Jennifer Johnson and her department for baking the cookies. We raised over \$600 for the children & families at Canuck Place. 302 Cookies were pre-ordered by staff (at the buy 6 for \$5 for most). So staff bought \$252 worth.
