The children listened with rapture as Ms. Leclerc read Hansel and Gretel with a spooky witch voice. The ensuing recreations of the story in the forest were a treat to watch.



EKOLogy East Kensington Outdoor Learning Program Our trip to Keery Park on Tuesday was also a success. The children learned how to walk and cross safely on a street. They collected litter in the park. We are happy to note there was actually very little to collect. We could overhear children questioning what kind of people would leave garbage in a nice forest. Our hope is that they learn to preserve the beauty of the natural spaces in our neighbourhood because of their act to clean it up. The children bubbled at the opportunity to climb low-lying limbs in the forest and to assess their level of risk by testing out the strength of each branch. There was then a quieter level of enthusiasm as the students created tiny fairy parks using finds from the forest floor. We are thankful that we have access to Keery Park so close to our school. We plan to make a habit of walking to the park twice a month.

Thank you to all the parents and guardians who drove or walked with us on our trips. Your support of our out trips is invaluable and part of how we create community.

Garden Update

At a gathering of keen parent garden enthusiasts on February


