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Staff Parking Lot – Student Safety Concerns

We continue to have concerns about the use of the staff parking lot. Even with repeated requests and signage, it continues to be used as a drop off and pick up area for parents, and students are also walking through it when they arrive to school in the morning and leave at the end of the day. This creates a potentially dangerous situation, and in addition to this, school and district staff often cannot find a parking place in the morning because parents are using the parking spaces. Please be advised that there will be changes to the supervision of the staff parking lot after Spring Break. There will be information sent home about these changes and alternative places for you to drop off and pick up your child/ren. The parking lot entrance will be closed to parents and there will be a teacher on supervision in the parking lot both before and after school. City By-Law officers and Police will be on site for the first week after spring break. We will also be encouraging students to walk or cycle to school and will be creating a goal for them to reach by walking to school on "Walk-To-School Wednesdays." There will be separate information coming out next week. We appreciate the cooperation of parents and guardians to make our parking lot a safer place for everyone.




- 1. Use respectful and appropriate language.

It is important to note that there is a significant difference between primary and intermediate students, especially in the area of respecting others and school or personal property.
