#### PARKING LOT REMINDERS KEEP MOVING FORWARD

As many of you drive your children to and from school, you can appreciate the congestion that occurs in our parking lot, particularly before and after school. We commit to you that we will do our best to get your children in the door safely, but we will need your help.

If you choose to enter the parking lot, please follow the protocol established for our drop off lane.

- Drivers are to stay in their car and continue to move toward the exit as space opens up. Parking your car in this lane stops the flow of traffic and results in frustration and unsafe conditions for your children
- Do not park in the DROP OFF ZONE, it's important that you keep moving forward to the next free space in the waiting spot.
- We will be asking students to meet you at the next available open spot in the DROP OFF zone. Students will not be permitted to wait at the start of the DROP OFF zone as it stops and slows down the traffic. Teachers and administrators will ask students to meet you further up if there is a spot.



- Do not sit in your car at pick up with the engine idling. It is particularly difficult for our Kindergarten children whose doors and windows open to that area.
- If you have intermediate children, it is strongly suggested that you identify a pick up spot away from the parking lot area.

Whenever possible, we encourage you to walk to school with your children.
