Budget:

- The teachers met together and gave Cathy Bartoloni their comments who gave it to Principal (to respect the strike rules).
- Fewer children are expected next year (1 division less) and then projected the year after to increase by 1 division. Principal says projections show 600+ kids over the next 10 years
- Al Pichler: what is the cost? Carolyn (parent) says it's the cost of a TOC per day for approximately 10 days. Principal will phone him to confirm numbers. Note: if the cost of TOC's rises his rate will rise accordingly. Auditions would aim to be before spring break, which play hasn't been decided yet, rehearsals would start right after spring break and the performance date would be near the end of April.
