Principal's Message

May 15th, 2020

At his press conference on Friday, Premier Horgan announced schools will begin to re-open in June. This was a broad statement to the public and it signaled the slow re-opening of things starting to return to normal. However, plans need to be in place that ensure the safety of students and staff before in class instruction resumes. Over the coming weeks, the district will provide clarity to families as to what a return to school may look like in June and into September.

The first step to have students return to Salish is to have students come and pick up their belongings from their lockers. When school resumes, in order for social distancing to happen, students will not be able to use a locker until the restrictions are removed. We sent a letter home on Friday outlining how families can come to the school and pick up student's belongings that have been cleaned out of lockers using the safety and cleaning protocols in place to clean lockers.

Please know that we are working at slowly re-opening our school to our Salish Wolves. We will move slowly, thoughtfully and safely as we enter the next stage of the gradual and part-time return to school. Remote and online learning will continue to be available for our students.

We learned this week that Mr. Mahli has been appointed as Principal of North Surrey Secondary effective July 1st, 2020. We are excited for Mr. Mahli but are very sad to bid him farewell. Mr. Mahli was instrumental in opening École Salish and we are grateful for his hard work. We congratulate him and wish him all the best in his new assignment.
