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Message from the Principal

Pedestrian Improvements

As a part of the City of Surrey's safe Schools Program, pedestrian improvements will be constructed on 158 St. and 90 Ave. near our school. The aim of Safe and Active Schools Program is to create a safe and friendly environment for children and teens to walk or cycle to school. To help achieve this goal, the City is constructing 25 pedestrian and traffic safety improvement projects at Surrey Schools.

A new sidewalk, including curb and gutter, will be built on the north side of 90 Avenue from 157 Street to 158 Street. The road will be widened to accommodate two way traffic and the parking lane will be relocated from the south side of 90 Avenue to the north side of 90 Avenue (closest to the school). Parking will not be permitted on the south side of 90 Avenue.

A new crosswalk and curb bulges, which increase pedestrian visibility and provide a reduced crossing

distance, will be constructed on 158 Street by the school's front entrance north of the parking lot driveway. Curb bulges will also be constructed at the intersection of 90 Avenue and 158 Street. A fence will be constructed in the grassy area between the pick-up/drop-off bay and the 158 Street sidewalk, to discourage jaywalking across the bay.
