




### **Student Covid-19 Vaccines**

Students born in 2009 or earlier are now eligible to register on the B.C. COVID-19 Immunization website.

Registration is now open for students between the ages of 12 and 17 to receive their first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. On Thursday afternoon the province announced that children born in 2009 or earlier (12 and older) can register on the B.C. COVID-19 Immunization website. The goal is to have students vaccinated by June 30, with second doses by Aug. 30.

To register, fill out your child's information at <u>getvaccinated.gov.bc.ca</u>, available 24/7 or call 1-833-838-2323 between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. any day of the week. You can also register in-person at any Service BC centre. After registering, you will receive a text, email or phone call when it is your turn to book a vaccine appointment. Don't expect to book an appointment the same day you register.

Once you have registered and have received your booking invitation, please do not delay booking an appointment. Bring your child's Care Card to their appointment. If your child does not have a personal health number, you can register by phone at 1-833-838-2323.

Booking invites will be sent to those who are older first, and most appointments will take place at the same immunization clinics used to vaccinate people in other age groups. Household and group vaccination options are also available. For more information, visit fraserhealth.ca/vaccine

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### School Fees 2021-2022

Each school year, parents support their child(ren)'s formal learning experiences in a wide variety of ways. We appreciate all that you do to ensure a successful year!

In addition to providing the school supplies itemized on a grade list, parents are periodically asked for monies to cover specific items and/or special events. No student will be denied the opportunity to participate in any school activity due to the inability to pay. Please contact me should you require any financial assistance.

As we plan for the upcoming school year, we anticipate the following costs knowing that our September and year ahead may look quite different from what we have come to know and expect. At this time, you can expect the following; however, School Supply Fees for 2021-2022 may change due to circumstances in schools as a result of Covid-19:

Student Planner: We encourage all students in Grades 1-7 to purchase a School Planner at a cost of \$5.00. Included in the planner is our school code of conduct, school calendar and school district information. We find this to be an excellent tool for facilitating home/school communication, as well as for developing our students' organizational skills. However, using our school planner is optional as a parent may purchase their own version.

Field Studies and Field Trips: Classes often enjoy educational visits to community facilities which extend and enhance the curriculum. While we use school monies or fundraise to cover the costs of such activities wherever possible, there are times when parents are asked to contribute towards the cost of the trip. We are thankful for the generous support of our PAC to help lower field studies costs. If you choose to have your child not participate in a field study, a suitable program will be provided at the school.

Musical Instruments: Grade 4 students may learn to play the recorder. Students will have the option of purchasing one through our music teacher for \$8.00 or receiving one on loan from the school. Also, our Grade 7 students who take band either purchase or rent an instrument. Costs vary depending on the instrument. Rentals can be arranged when school resumes in September.

### School Supplies: Grades 1-7

A grade supply list will be sent home with your child's report card for parents to purchase their child's school supplies on their own. Costs for supplies vary based on grade. Please note that specialized items may be requested by individual teachers when classes are organized in September.

### Kindergarten School Supplies:

Teachers will purchase supplies for students in Kindergarten. The costs are between \$40 and \$45 per student. Payment information will be confirmed in September.
