6. School naming – What considerations are important to you in naming schools? Jordan discussed the naming of three schools that will be opening in the future and the possible renaming of other facilities. He stated that the Board is supportive of Indigenous names and he is asking for peoples' collective views.

There was open discussion and it was agreed that the creation of a bank of potential names and phrases based on the history of an area would be very helpful.

The school naming topic will be left on the agenda for future council meetings.

Jordan stated that he would send out the addresses of the three new schools.

7. Equity Lab – Overview of Emerging Themes – Which theme resonates most with you?

Lyn referred to the Equity Lab – Overview document and reviewed the five themes that emerged from the guide groups.

She stated there is an upcoming campfire gathering to discuss the themes and creating a system wide response. Models and prototypes will be implemented, data collected and scaled to meet the needs of families and staff.

Shelley shared a personal experience of racism that took place at one of her school's.

Jordan stated that the district is committed to work on racism and that Hooks Global is developing a proposal for the district.
