School Closures Information...

Sometimes extreme weather conditions or other circumstances can cause class cancellations at a school, or district wide on short notice. The District will do its best to communicate the status of schools by 7:00 am.

Sometimes the decision to send students home if they have care can come to us close to the entry bell. We will always keep all students who are without parents and contact you by phone for safe pick up. All students should check in to the office and should never return home on their own without contact made by the school staff. **Please discuss this safety protocol with your children.**

Lates and Absences

Please call and let us know if your child will be late or absent. We call you if you have not called in so we can ensure the safety of your child. If we are not available to pick up the phone, please leave a message on the answering machine. This would help us at the office immensely.

Lunches/Water Bottles

Part of the recommendations is for all students to bring water bottles and lunches to school daily in the morning. We will not be allowing parents in the building or to drop off lunches as we try to limit any exposures from outside the school.



Parent Visitor Protocol

Due to COVID 19 restrictions, we will not be allowing parents and visitors in the building without prior approval. All visitors should report to the front window of the school. One of our office staff will be happy to assist you.

School Cash Online ...

School Cash online is an online payment program run through the School District. It is completely safe and does not cost any additional Fees. With COVID 19 we would like to limit the amount of germs that may be passed through cash transactions. We will use this online method for things like planners and Kindergarten Supplies. Inclement Weather...

The weather can be unpredictable in September. Please check the weather in the morning and ensure that your child is dressed appropriately. Please be careful when walking to school as the ground may be icy and slippery. If you are dropping off or picking up your child please follow Safe Drop Off guidelines. Have a waiting spot for picking up your child.

Crossing Guards...

Our Crossing Guards are going to be starting their training and will start cross walk duty in the mornings and after school in October. Please watch for them and be patient as they start their new roles. They will have vests, whistles and set out cones for safety.



Drop off and Pick Up Safety Policy...

- ALWAYS HAVE YOUR CHILDREN EXIT TO THE SIDEWALK SIDE OF THE VEHICLE
- Never open the door to the interior of the street to exit out as cars may be passing
- Please drive slowly in front of the school.
- Look both ways before exiting the drop off area to go back in the passing lane
- Do not double park on the street as it creates unnecessary congestion
- Do not overpass a stopped car as they may be stopped for students to cross
- Park one block down the street and walk to pick up your children
- Do not park or drive in the parking lot during pick up or drop off times.

Change of Clothes

Some students have had to call home to get a change of clothes after Recess or Lunch as they have slipped and fallen. It is not a bad idea to have a change of clothes at the school or in their backpack, particularly the primary students.





Covid Safety Protocols and How You Can Help

Students and staff have many protocols in place to make sure we can keep everyone safe. Routine handwashing/sanitizing, custodial cleaning of high touch surfaces, distancing and health checks are daily procedures that we take.





All staff, parents and volunteers who enter the building are required to be doing daily health checks. Thank you for not sending your children to school when they have symptoms of illness or Covid. Notifications will be sent out at the discretion of Fraser Health. The notifications will let you know if there is self monitoring (still come to school but monitor for symptoms) or isolation (not to be coming to school for the time Fraser Health asks you to isolate).

Please do your Daily Health Check and make sure your child does not have symptoms of Covid-19.

^{*}Check BCCDC's Symptoms of COVID-19 regularly to ensure the list is up to date.

If you answered "YES" to one of the questions included under 'Key Symptoms of Illness' (excluding fever), you should stay home for 24 hours from when the symptom started. If the symptom improves, you may return to school when you feel well enough. If the symptom persists or worsens, seek a health assessment.

If you answered "YES" to two or more of the questions included under 'Symptoms of Illness' or you have a fever, seek a health assessment. A health assessment includes calling 8-1-1, or a primary care provider like a physician or nurse practitioner. If a health assessment is required, you should not return to school until COVID-19 has been excluded and your symptoms have improved.

When a COVID-19 test is recommended by the health assessment:

- If the COVID-19 test is **positive**, you should stay home until you are told by public health to end self-isolation. In most cases this is 10 days after the onset of symptoms. Public health will contact everyone with a positive test.
- If the COVID-19 test is **negative**, you can return to school once symptoms have improved and you feel well enough. Symptoms of common respiratory illnesses can persist for a week or more. Re-testing is not needed unless you develop a new illness.
- If a COVID-19 test is recommended but is not done because you choose not to have the test, or you do
 not seek a health assessment when recommended, and your symptoms are not related to a previously
 diagnosed health condition, you should stay home from school until 10 days after the onset of symptoms,
 and then you may return if you are feeling well enough.

If a COVID-19 test is not recommended by the health assessment, you can return to school when symptoms improve and you feel well enough. Testing may not be recommended if the assessment determines that the symptoms are due to another cause (i.e. not COVID-19).

If you answered "YES" to questions 2 or 3, use the <u>COVID-19 Self-Assessment Tool</u> to determine if you should seek testing for COVID-19.

A health-care provider note (i.e. a doctor's note) should not be required to confirm the health status of any individual.

WE Kinvig Code of Conduct

At WE Kinvig, the central theme is Honesty, Caring, Leadership and using your WITS:

Honesty (Take ownership and responsibility of your actions)

Caring (Care for yourself, others, and the environment in which we learn) Leadership (Lead by example, and take on roles at the school that can help others)

Positive Behaviour: Good choices by students will be recognized and reinforced both verbally, and with written good behavior slips called Dragon Badges. Prizes are given out throughout the year from the Dragon Badge bin.

Inappropriate Behaviour: can consist of, but is not limited to:

- · rudeness, swearing
- · fighting (or play fighting), or hitting
- · lack of respect for others, using put downs, teasing
- throwing objects (rocks, sticks, snowballs, etc.)
- · defiant behaviour, insolence
- · running in the halls
- · unauthorized leaving of school grounds
- littering, damaging property, or misusing equipment



Consequences

Consequences will be applied in a fair and consistent manner, respecting individual rights, responsibilities, age and maturity.

Inappropriate behaviour typically has the following consequences in escalating order (Depending on the offence):

- · review of expectations and a timeout
- · review of expectations, written assignment and/or loss of privileges
- parents are informed
- meeting with the parents
- short-term (in school or at home) suspension up to 5 days
- long-term suspension (over 5 days) or referral to district program
- consultation with police and/or fire department
- expulsion

Safe & Caring School Environments:

Are Free From Acts Of

- bullying, cyber-bullying, harassment, threat, intimidation
- violence in any form including play fighting, or throwing objects at others
- abuse in any form, including physical and verbal abuse
- discrimination, racism or prejudice in any form
- · vandalism or willful damage of school property
- retribution against a person who has reported incidents
- · theft of school or other's personal property

Do Not Tolerate the Presence Of

- · intoxicating or banned substances
- · weapons or replica (toy) weapons and explosives
- · intruders or trespassers

Notification

As circumstances warrant (based on the seriousness of the behavior), administrators will advise other parties following a behaviour incident
