Message from Mr. Lam



We are happy to announce that we raised \$1,271 for cancer research during the Terry Fox run. We will have an extended recess and something fun for the students to watch sometime next week to celebrate meeting our fundraising goals. It was nice to be able to run around the neighbourhood this year. Thank you for your financial

donations and to those of you who were also able to help out physically on the day of the run. It was also wonderful to see many of you on Meet the Teacher night.

On Wednesday afternoon, the Surrey Board of Education met with Fraser Health's Medical Health Officer responsible for schools to discuss masking, vaccinations, testing and exposure notifications. At that time, the Board made a decision to expand the provincial mask mandate to include all students from kindergarten to Grade 12. Earlier today, the provincial government announced that these measures will be in place province-wide effective Monday, October 4th. This means that all staff and students (K-12) must wear a mask when inside a school or on a bus.

Most of our younger children have already been wearing their masks to school. We recognize this will be a change for some, so we will work closely with our students on mask wearing in a positive manner and ensure all of our students continue to have access to non-medical face masks.

The Board of Education also discussed additional measures including vaccination clinics, testing, and notifications:

- School-based Vaccine Clinics: The Board of Education will partner with Fraser Health to examine hosting vaccine clinics in our schools for the purpose of increasing vaccination rates in our communities where rates are low. These clinics will only be available to our school communities staff, students and their families.
- COVID-19 Mouth Rinse/Gargle test kits: The Board will promote the use of <u>take-home</u> <u>COVID-19 Mouth Rinse/Gargle Sample Collection kits</u> to families with children who become symptomatic while at school. This initiative will help increase access to testing and work towards preventing COVID-19 transmission in the school environment.
- Notifications: Families are now able to access COVID-19 exposures on the <u>Fraser Health</u> website. Fraser Health will post the school name and date(s) of exposure on their website <u>here</u>. Our Board will continue to work with Fraser Health to do all we can to ensure that notification processes are timely, transparent, and include information about clusters.

We would like to thank Fraser Health for their continued partnership and expertise during this pandemic, and our school community for your support.

Interim report cards should be coming home to you either on October 18th or 19th. On Thursday, October 21st, students will be dismissed early at 1:30 p.m. The purpose for this early dismissal day is for parent/teacher conferences, if needed after reading through the interim reports. The classroom teachers will provide you with more information closer to the date on how you can sign up for an appointment.

On behalf of the staff, I want to wish you all the very best Thanksgiving with your loved ones. Even though we are still dealing with this virus, we are thankful for the many blessings we experience each day. I am thankful for being part of such a fantastic learning community and for every day the children are able to enter into the school building to learn with their peers.

WALK & ROLL TO SCHOOL DAY

On Wednesday, October 6th, we are encouraging all "Berkshire Broncs" to either walk or roll to school. This includes biking, roller blading, scooters, etc. Please make sure they have their bike helmets on. Once the students arrive on school grounds, they are to look for a student leader with a clipboard to earn a house point. The student leaders will be in two locations: at the front of the school

We are going to start with Delta Gymnastics coming in and providing the children 3 lessons in the gym. The instructor, together with the classroom teachers, will be going over safety protocols on how to use the equipment properly and will be following COVID health and safety precautions as well. PAC will be using some of the fundraising money to help cover

"A permission slip will also need to be signed by parents/guardians for the children to participate in the gymnastics lessons. Other activities planned are curling lessons sometime after Christmas and Hip Hop lessons in May.
