### From Newsletter 7 – COVID Protocols

We are committed to ensuring our students can continue to learn as safely as possible in-person by closely following all the measures put forth in the <u>updated provincial guidance for schools</u> that were issued in late December and our district's <u>communicable disease plan</u>. These measures include

- continued mask wearing
- daily health checks
- staying home when sick
- a continued focus on hand washing
- daily cleaning and disinfecting protocols
- maximizing space between people
- holding virtual meetings
- limiting visitors to schools
- no spectators at events



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### **Omicron and Contact Tracing**

In Dr. Zbar's <u>message</u> last week, she provided an update on notifications and explained how contact tracing has become much more difficult with the Omicron variant given how quickly it spreads. What this means is that Public Health is no longer able to contact everyone who tests positive and school exposures will not be issued for individual cases. In the event of a declared outbreak, Public Health will issue a public notification.

Public Health will continue to work with us to support schools if, for example, there is a significant increase in absenteeism that is atypical for this time of year, and actions are to be taken, including messaging to the parents and guardians of the affected grade or school community.

Please do not issue your own communication to the school community about a potential exposure. We continue to rely on Public Health to determine when/if an individual was infectious while at school.

#### **Ministry of Education Learning Survey**

During the months of January to April, School District 36 is participating in the 2022 Ministry of Education Electronic Anonymous Student Learning Survey Project in cooperation with all other school districts throughout the Province. Parents/Guardians/Caregivers can complete the online Anonymous Student Learning Surveys **any time before 11:59 pm April 29<sup>th</sup>, 2022**, providing immediate results to the school and the district.

#### To complete the survey:

- 1. Go to any computer that has an up-to-date internet browser access
- 2. Go to http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat\_survey/access.htm
- 3. Under the section *Direct Access no logon number required* select:
  - District: the name of your child's district
  - School: the name of your child's school
  - Language: the language of your choice
- 4. Complete the survey by clicking on the appropriate circle to answer each question. Move to the next set of questions by clicking on the right arrow in the bottom right corner of the screen. Click on the left arrow to navigate backwards.
- 5. When you are finished the survey, you will get a message "Thank you for sharing your views".
- 6. Once complete, your school will have the results immediately.

1. Proof of birth date for the student (birth certificate or passport).

2. Proof of guardianship (parents/guardians as shown on birth certificate or other appropriate legal documentation)

3. Proof of citizenship for both parents (birth certificate, citizenship card, passport, landed immigrant document, permanent resident card)

4. Three pieces of identification showing the address of residence (purchase or rental agreement, utility bill, driver's license, etc.)

5. Immunization Record

6. Care Card #
