

# Kindergarten Registration:

Kindergarten registration is now open. If your child will turn five years old before January 1, 2018 they are eligible to begin school in September, 2017. In person registration is required at your neighbourhood school.



The following documents are required when registering:

- 1. Proof of Birth Date for the student (birth certificate or passport)
- 2. Proof of guardianship (as shown on child's birth certificate, or other appropriate legal documentation such as landed immigrant document or guardianship order).
- 3. Proof of citizenship for both the parent and student (Canadian birth certificate, citizenship card, passport, landed immigrant document, permanent resident card, enhanced driver's license or enhanced identification card).
- 4. Proof of residence (purchase or rental agreement, utility bill).

portfolio on a regular basis. Providing comments and feedback on your child's learning can be very helpful in motivating your child and participating in their learning process. Some helpful sentence starters to respond to their learning might be:

- I notice how you... (be specific)
- I am so proud that you are now able to...
- I can see evidence of growth...
- When I compare these two pieces of work, I notice...
- I was pleased with how you did this work because...
- I know you found this work challenging, but look at how you...
- Look now you can...
- Before you had trouble with... but now you can...
- You are doing better at...
- I how you... you still need help with\_\_\_\_\_ and I can help you.
- Can you explain your thinking about this...
- I enjoyed how this is something new that you learned!
- You've achieved your goal of\_\_\_\_\_!!
- What I like about this work (artifact) is...
- You have improved...
- I can see evidence of growth toward your goal because...
- One way at home that we can try to help you is....
- This was not your best work, what could you do differently next time?
- At the beginning of the year you did not know... but now...
- I can see you tried really hard to....
- I am impressed with this work because...
