

After-School Play

Over Spring Break, the Surrey School District, in collaboration with Public Health,

looked at school Covid-19 exposure data across Surrey schools in order to find ways to limit any potential future spreads. One of the most common threats discovered continues to be after-school play during which students from multiple cohorts interact in close proximity. This has been mentioned before, but we have now been told to close our playgrounds after school and to relay the message that students and their vacate parents must school immediately after pick up. This is difficult for me to request because I believe that there is great value in play, but given our current health situation. I know that it is necessary. Staff will provide gentle reminders as needed, but we ask that you remain mindful of the purpose of this decision and understand that it was not made lightly.

New App Simplifies Students' Daily Health Check

Thanks to a new app, it's easier than ever for students and parents to complete their daily health check each morning.

Developed in partnership with Public Health and the BC Centre for Disease Control, and a group of students, the K-12 daily health check website and mobile app help students and families make the best decisions on whether to attend school, stay home, or take other measures. Questions and answers are easy to understand and are based on current health guidelines. All content is written with the K-12 age group in mind.

As indicated in the <u>Provincial COVID-19 Health Safety Guidelines for K-12 Settings</u>, parents and caregivers should assess their children daily for illness before sending them to school.

A reminder from the Surrey School District Health and Safety Team

All families need to do daily health checks before leaving home for school.

It is very important that all adults continue to **use social distancing (the 2m guideline) and wear masks** during pick-up and drop-off at the school. Please make sure you do not forget your mask at home or in the car.

We also understand that younger children like to be accompanied by their parents/guardians to the school, near their exterior classroom doors. Please always **wear your masks and continue to maintain a social distance of 2 metres**. Please do not approach your child in the line-up.

Lastly, we ask that all families please leave school grounds as soon as possible after drop off and pick up. As much as we like to play on the playground after school, now is not the time to be engaging in such activities – we need to maintain social distancing, so please head home as soon as possible.

Let's keep up our very good COVID practices to ensure Royal Heights remains a safe place to learn and work. **Together we can do it!**

- I notice how you ... (be specific, focusing more on perseverance and less on "ability", avoiding phrases such as "you are so smart" or "you are such a talented artist")
- What were you supposed to learn by doing this work?
- How does your work compare to the criteria?
- What are you most proud of? Why?
- I can see you tried really hard to
- I can see evidence of growth. You used to... but now you...
- When I compare what you used to do with what you do now, I notice...

- What do you notice when you compare these two pieces of work?
- · Can you explain your thinking about this ...?
- What I like about this work is ...
- · What do you like most about this work?
- Do you think you need some help with...?
- What do you think you could do differently next time?
- How could you have done that differently?
- · What would you like to get better at? Why?
- What do you think you will try next time?
- · Tell me (more) about ...
