### Communicating Student Learning: Interim Communication Week November 1<sup>st</sup> – 5th

There are three possible means of communicating your child's learning this year. Your child's teacher will have communicated with you which method they are using. Each one is designed to provide you with snapshots of your child's learning and progress to date:

- The reporting template (This is sent home three times each year, with the 1<sup>st</sup> report home on Dec. 10<sup>th</sup>. Each report focusses on specific learning goals and your child's progress to date);
- Freshgrade digital portolios (Files are regularly uploaded by your child's teacher to show progress in relation to our curricular goals);
- Spaces digital portfolio District PILOT (Ms. Gardiner and Ms. Brennan are part of this district pilot which also houses files that show progress in relation to curricular goals).

Prior to digital portfolios, every parent would also receive an interim communication twice a year from their child's teacher. This communication was to give you an additional snapshot of some aspect of your child's learning to date, as well as feedback on their effort and work habits.

This blend of different ways to communicate student learning may be confusing when you have more than one child, and have different reporting methods to understand. Please do not hesitate to reach out to your child's teacher with any questions at any point in the year.

This week, to ensure you are receiving adequate feedback about your child's learning, you can expect some form of direct communication from your child's teacher. This may be an email asking you to check certain posts on Freshgrade, it may be a written form with both teacher feedback and student self-reflection in relation to learning goals, it may be a phone call to discuss your child's learning in more depth.

Whatever it looks like, this interim communication is intended to provide you with a snapshot of your child's learning in specific areas that the teacher has focussed on for the last several weeks. As always, please contact your child's teacher with any questions or concerns.

#### **Bothwell GROWs Assemblies**

We are proud of each student at Bothwell. Every child will grow in different ways throughout the year, and we will celebrate this growth and achievement at our monthly "Bothwell GROWs" celebration assemblies. At some point in the year, every child will have an opportunity to be recognised for their growth in one or more of the following areas:

**G** = **Generous**...this includes with one's time, or assistance and leadership around the school; generosity results in one giving more than what is expected or required, and often goes hand in hand with kindness and understanding. When we have a generous heart, we slow down, spend time with one another, and offer our help, all of which makes Bothwell a great place to be.

**R** = **Reflective...**one of the most significant things that helps support a child's learning and emotional growth is to be reflective. This is central to students' Core Competency development, as well as a necessary skill in learning how to learn. As a child learns to be more reflective about their learning, they grow in independence, which is one of our goals in education.

**O** = **Open-minded...** our curriculum is centred around critical and creative thinking across all subject areas. In order to be a critical and creative thinker, one must be open-minded, ready to embrace new ideas, information and perspectives.

**W** = Wonder-full...asking questions and demonstrating curiosity make for some of the most engaged learning experiences. Children's questions and sense of wonder inspire all of us. The world is full of new things to learn and discover, and we encourage children to venture forth and explore their natural sense of wonder...in the classroom, in nature, in books, in art, science, history...everywhere!

Your child's teacher will contact you to inform you of this recognition. At this time, we are not permitted to have parents attend assemblies. However, your child will bring home a certificate and another symbolic gift to celebrate and honour their learning and growth at Bothwell.
