SAFETY PROTOCOLS

GROWING NORTH RIDGE

We are now currently at 495 students! We have grown over 80 students in the past three years! We have received confirmation from the district that we will be receiving an additional portable over the winter break, which will be placed on our front lawn outside the kindergarten rooms. Ms. Ichiki's class will move from the gym to that portable in January. Also, Ms. Hua's portable will be moved at the same time from the parking lot to the front lawn next to the new portable. Ms. Hua's portable is being moved to free up parking spots for our staff, which now totals 66.

SAFETY TO AND FROM SCHOOL



These November days are dark, rainy and gloomy. Students, remember to stop, look both ways and if a car is coming, wait until the vehicle is fully stopped before you cross the street. Please make sure you walk to school with a sibling, friend or an adult as traffic is busy around the school and travelling in groups is safer than being alone.

ALLERGY-AWARE SCHOOL

Several of our students at North Ridge have severe life-threatening allergies/allergic reactions to peanuts, nuts and their by-products, as well as other food products. Please help us in doing everything possible to protect these students. Some ways you can help include: refraining from sending food to school that contain peanuts/nuts, remind your child to wash their hands carefully after eating if there is an anaphylactic student in your child's classroom and remind your child to not share or trade snacks. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we continue to make our school a safe environment for all of our students.

Please inform the school immediately if your child has a severe life-threatening allergy or medical condition so we can ensure appropriate procedures are in place

CSL

Communicating Student Learning at North Ridge

This year your child may receive one of two different reporting formats to communicate your child's learning.

Communicating Student Learning (CSL) Template. This reporting format will be a written document received three times per year. It will include both teacher and student assessment and reflection on your child's learning goals. The CSL reports will be issued December 4, March 11 and June 24.

Digital Electronic Portfolios (FreshGrade): Some teachers may choose to use FreshGrade, which is an electronic, on-line portfolio that is updated in an ongoing manner throughout the year. FreshGrade students will also receive a paper summative document in June. If your child's teacher is using this format, you will have received a FreshGrade parental consent letter.

PARENTS AS PARTNERS

Homework Hints

- 1. Provide a well-lit, quiet distraction-free area to do homework.
- 2. Put personal devices that have social media, game apps etc... away during homework time.
- 3. Set aside a homework time, ideally the same time every day. This will help create routine.
- 4. If your child has no homework, you can give additional activities such as writing letters, journal, online academic activities, reading...
- 5. Act as your child's advisor. You are there to help them when needed but you want to help build independence.
- 6. Homework in elementary should be relatively light in quantity. Students should understand the concepts assigned for homework and homework can also include daily reading.
- 7. Show interest in your child's homework, check it over and be positive and encouraging about their efforts!
- 8. Remember, you are helping build work ethic and positive habits your child can build on through their years.
