### Principal's Message

Our first semester is well underway and our school continues to be a busy, vibrant place. It is great to have the energy back in the building and students involved in the school activities. Please look for a list of all our clubs that are currently offered, in this newsletter, on our website, and on Panther time. Students can also get a handout at the main office that also lists all of our clubs as well as the sponsor teacher and days the clubs meet.

While we are reminded every day that we are still dealing with Covid (masks, physical distance reminders, capacity limits etc.) we are very happy to have a return to full face-to-face instruction for all courses and grades. With this in mind, please know that teachers organize and prepare their lessons for this face-to-face instruction. This is the only mode of instruction in our building. If you are interested in other options for your son/daughter, such as virtual courses/online learning, please book an appointment with your son/daughter's alpha counsellor or vice-principal to explore options.

As the border restrictions start to lift, there will undoubtedly be increased travel. A reminder that there is no substitute for in-class learning. We understand there may be extenuating circumstances in which a student needs to be away from school. However, if a student will be away from school for five days or longer, an Extended Absence Notification Form must be filled out. You can get this from the main office. As you will see on the form, the school is not required to provide ongoing homework while your son/daughter is on vacation and that being away for an extended period of time may have an impact on learning, progress, and achievement in classes. We simply want everyone in our school community to be aware of this and to reinforce the notion that school attendance is arguably one of the most important indicators of school success. Our first reporting period is quickly approaching. On November 15th, semester #1 midterm marks will be posted to the MyEdBC portal. All students are encouraged to keep up with their work in preparation for the midterm marks and to make up any missed work. A reminder to all students to take pride in everything you do and to complete your work to your best ability.

On Wednesday November 3<sup>rd</sup>, our grade 9 students participated in Take Our Kids To Work Day. Students had an opportunity to go to work with a family member to hopefully get a "slice of reality" with regards to a workday vs. a day at school. A big thank you to our Career Department for all their work organizing this great opportunity for our students.

As we approach the sometimes dark, wet days of winter, visibility can be a challenge while driving. I ask everyone to please slow down and drive with caution in and around the school parking lots and surrounding streets. Students are also reminded to use designated cross walks and to make sure vehicles have seen you and are stopped before crossing. ### **Provincial Graduation Assessments**

The Ministry requires all students to write provincial assessments that focus on literacy and numeracy skills. While they are required for graduation, they are broad-based and not tied to a particular course or course mark. Most students will be required to write 3 assessments before graduating (Numeracy and Literacy in grade 10 and Literacy again in grade 12). Below we have highlighted when students will be writing these assessments at LTSS in 2021-2022. Detailed schedules will be released closer to the assessment dates.

### **Numeracy/Literacy** Assessment

If you are in Grade 10, you will write the assessments in the semester you have Math 10 (Numeracy) and English 10 (Literacy) in January or June.

If you are in Grade 11 and have NOT written the assessment, you will be scheduled in *April\*\** 

If you are in Grade 12 and have NOT written the assessment, you will write November 3, 2021 in Room B202. Student names are posted outside of the main office.

Literacy 8:00 – 11:00 Numeracy 12:00 – 3:00

Grade 12 Literacy Assessment – NEW THIS YEAR!

If you are in **Grade 12**, you will write in the semester you have English 12 (January or June\*\*)

If you have already completed English 12, you will need to see Mr. Ghuman to schedule a time.



### WHAT'S OUT THERE?

Use Education Planner BC's <u>Program Search</u> to find different programs here in BC. Search and focus by subject, location, length of time, or try different keywords or filters.

### WHAT FITS YOU?

Compare a few different post secondary institutions and programs. Do they fit with your career goals, the time you have, and how much you can afford? Many programs offer laddering or transfer opportunities - meaning where you start is not always where you finish.

### KNOW YOUR INSTITUTION'S ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS.

Each institution has its own rules on how you can be part of their school, called General Institution Admission Requirements. Know them. Meet them.

### APPLY ONLINE

Create one account and apply to multiple post secondary institutions. *Please check the Post Secondary you wish to attend to see when Applications are due.* You must check the website of the school you are interested in attending. On-line admissions open as early as mid-August so you need to research the important dates for your post-secondary institution.

#### As a general guideline, the (final) admission deadline for <u>universities</u> falls between December and March.

Application deadlines for BCIT and many Colleges vary by program and may extend into the spring and summer months; you must check the school's website for the specific details of your program.



Please come to the *Career Centre* located in room T202 located on the table in Career Centre to request your Official Transcript. Please allow *three days* for processing.

OR

Do you require a Unofficial Transcript for Scholarship Applications, Out of Province Applications or Specialty Programs? Student Transcripts Service (STS) is an online application for students to view their school marks and send transcripts electronically.

### You can order your transcripts online using the Student Transcript Service.

o You may send up to 25 transcripts to post-secondary institutions at no charge

o You may send 1 transcript to a 3rd party at no charge. Additional transcripts are \$10 each.

Orders are processed in 3 – 6 business days, then sent electronically or mailed using standard Canada Post letter mail service

You will receive your graduation certificate at no charge from your school once you have met graduation requirements. You can also order copies online using the Student Transcripts Service for \$10 each.


