Surrey teacher wins national award (Peace Arch News)

A Fleetwood Park Secondary teacher has earned national recognition. The Prime Minister's Awards are the highest honour awarded by the Government of Canada in teaching and early learning.

Secondary school humanities teacher and department head, Derek Fournier, has been awarded with the teaching excellence award. "I was pleasantly shocked," Fournier says when he found out he received this honour.

Fournier has been a teacher for 32 years, starting back in 1993. Fournier says he was

approached by Fleetwood Park's principal, who told him she wanted to put him up for this award back in early February. She told him that the teaching staff, along with some students and parents, had put together a little package with testimonials and a breakdown of the work he's done for his school. This package highlighted his work in inclusivity, creativity and proper use of digital resources and also showcased the successful 'Civic Mirror' program that has been adopted by his colleagues at Fleetwood Park.

That doesn't even scratch the surface of what Fournier has offered his students, community and colleagues. When asked what it is about teaching that brings him the most happiness, he shares that his favourite thing is when September rolls around and he meets all the students for the first time. "They don't know it yet, but we're gonna bond them into a little family," he shares. Fournier explains that humanities is an all-year program so he is with the student throughout that year. "It takes time making those connections. Sometimes it takes all the way to the day before the end of school but you know, that's my goal with those guys," he says.

This Fleetwood Park teacher explains that life moved on after the application and it wasn't until the first day of school in September that he was emailed from the Prime Minister's Office to tell him he had won the award for teaching excellence. "That was a lot to have going on the first day," he says. "I'm kinda humbled by the whole thing, it's nice to be recognized." Fournier was sworn to secrecy until the news was released publicly in October.

Even though he is the person who was awarded this honour, he shares that if it weren't for his colleagues and community he wouldn't be where he is today. "This award is certainly representative of our whole school community," Fournier says. The Prime Minister's Awards have existed for over 30 years to showcase the work teachers and educators are doing.



MyEd BC Accounts & Report Cards

MyEd BC is the student information software that the Surrey School District and many school districts use. Students automatically have an account and please note that report cards are published and found on MyEd BC.

Login Tips: Do NOT copy/paste the temporary password.

The copy process sometimes adds a space.

It must be entered exactly. The password is case sensitive.

Creating Your Password

Criteria

- 8-14 characters
- Minimum 1 uppercase letter, minimum 1 lowercase letter
- Minimum 1 number
- Minimum 1 special symbol or character: # or \$ or ! or @
- Your password **cannot** contain: first name, middle name, last name, date of birth, personal id or sequential letters or numbers

Sample of acceptable passwords:

Jan2017\$, Snow999!, Welcome1\$



Write your password down and keep it in a secure area for future reference.

If You Forget Your Password

(If you have answered the security question in your name)

- Enter your Login ID
- Click on "I forgot my password"
- MyEd BC will email you a new temporary password.

About Passwords

- Passwords are valid for 90 days.
- After 90 days, you will be prompted to create a new password immediately.
- Ten unsuccessful login attempts will disable your account. If this happens you will have to wait for it to be re-enabled.
- Call the school office to request that your account be reactivated.
- Need a password reset? Did you receive an email with MyEd BC login information? Please contact the school office at fleetwoodpark@surreyschools.ca.

MyEd BC Parent Portal

As your child progresses through secondary school, your involvement remains a key part of their success. We encourage all families to regularly check and familiarize themselves with the [MyED Parent Portal](#). This portal is an essential tool for staying informed and engaged in your child's education.

Through the Parent Portal, you can:

- View **learning updates** - Monitor progress and celebrate achievements. November 28th is the first Learning Update
- Monitor your child's **attendance records** - Know when your child is in class and address any concerns early.
- **Class schedules & teachers names** - Stay informed about your child's daily routine and the teachers name for when booking parent teacher meetings. November 5th is the first Parent Teacher Meetings.

Provincial Assessments

As part of the graduation requirements, students must complete three provincial assessments: Literacy 10, Numeracy 10, and Literacy 12.

Please note: November Graduation Assessment Administration Session CANCELLED

Due to BC General Employees' Union (BCGEU) strike action in the BC Public Service, the Graduation Assessment Session for November 3-7, 2025 will be cancelled for all grade 10 and 12 assessments. The next available session will begin on January 12, 2026 and will be extended by an additional week, to January 30, to allow more time for a larger administration.

The Ministry has confirmed that early admission to post-secondary institutions in B.C. will not be impacted by the cancellation, as students are able to write the assessments in another session (January, April, or June) and submit their results when completed.

This year's process differs from previous years:

- Only students enrolled in English 12/English 10/Math 10 during Semester 1 will write their Literacy Assessment and/or Numeracy Assessment in the winter (January).
- Students taking these courses in Semester 2 will write the assessment in the spring (April/June)

RE: E-bikes and e-scooters on school property

As we settle into the new school year, we are bringing your attention to important safety concerns about the use of e-scooters and e-bikes on Surrey Schools property.

Recently, the [City of Surrey announced](#) e-scooters are not permitted on public property – including roadways, sidewalks or public parks within Surrey. The City also published concerns regarding improper storage and charging, leading to the potential risk of fire or explosion.

As a result, Surrey Schools will not permit the use or storage of electric scooters on Surrey Schools property.

Electric Scooters

As you may know, the Province of British Columbia launched the E-Scooter Pilot Project (the “Pilot”) on April 5, 2024. Under this initiative, e-scooters may only be used on public roads in municipalities that are participating in the Pilot. Please note that the cities of Surrey and White Rock are not participating municipalities. [According to provincial guidance, electric scooters cannot be ridden on public roads or sidewalks in municipalities not included in the Pilot.](#)

In addition, our school communities have raised the following concerns:

- **Safety:** Repeated concerns from Surrey Schools staff, parents, and the wider community regarding speed around vehicles and younger children and a lack of helmets.
- **Storage:** Issues related to misplaced, stolen, or damaged electric scooters. Surrey Schools is not responsible for the loss, theft, or damage of personal property brought onto school district premises ([Surrey Schools Policy 5809](#)).

E-Bikes

With respect to e-bikes, the [Motor Assisted Cycle \(E-Bike\) Regulation](#) outlines specific legal requirements, including age restrictions. As a reminder:

- Students must be at least **14 years old** to ride a light e-bike.
- Students must be at least **16 years old** to ride a standard e-bike.

E-Bikes and E-Scooters



Please review the definitions of standard and light e-bikes to ensure compliance: [E-bike requirements](#).

Surrey Schools expects students to dismount e-bikes when on school property. In addition, e-bikes may not be charged at school or stored inside school buildings.

Final Note

This is an evolving landscape with restrictive regulations for children and youth. We encourage parents and guardians to carefully review the applicable regulations before permitting their child to use an e-scooter on private property: [E-scooter rules and safety](#).

A reminder as we move forward, as per [Surrey Schools Policy 5809](#), Surrey Schools is not responsible for the loss, theft, or damage of personal property, including e-scooters and e-bikes brought onto school property.



Obtaining a Drivers' Abstract:


Step 1: Go to ICBC.com and on the top tab bar hover over "Driver Licencing & ID" and select "Your Licence" from the drop-down menu. Next, in left-side menu bar, select the tab labelled "Your driving record".

Step 2: Click on the purple button labelled "Get your driving records".



Step 3: Enter in your Name and BC driver's licence number and select "Personal driving record".

Step 4: ICBC will send the drivers' abstract in a PDF to your specified email address which you may print and submit to the school office.



Immunizations—Thursday, November 13, 2025

Public Health Nurses will be providing immunizations at Fleetwood Park Secondary School on the following dates:

- Nov 13, 2025
- February 11, 2026 (Catch up)

This year's Immunization process will be slightly different than previous years. Fraser Health will deliver consent forms to the school on **October 22, 2025**. These forms will be for students in **Grade 8-12** who are missing immunizations.

The nurses will begin with **Grade 9 students**, as this is the primary grade for scheduled vaccines. Nurses will then proceed with students in other grades, working from **Grade 12 down to Grade 8**.

Please note: It is possible that not all Grade 9 students will be immunized on November 13th. Fraser Health will return in February for catch up.

It is important for caregivers to check the child's immunization history and update any records online prior to submitting consent.

School Vaccination Information for Parents

Getting vaccinated on schedule is the best way to protect yourself from many dangerous diseases. Public health regularly checks immunization records for students in Grades 6-12 to help make sure they are up to date on vaccines.

We offer all routine vaccines needed for students in Grades 6-12 when students are in school.

Families can check their child's immunization records online to see if they need any vaccines by logging into immunizationconsent.gov.bc.ca/s/ then looking at "Immunization forecast".



Give consent for the child's vaccines online

This year, students, parents, or caregivers of students in Grades 6-12 have the option to provide consent for vaccines online. You can fill out consent now or any time before the school clinic.

To give online consent for immunizations, scan this QR code or go to immunizationconsent.gov.bc.ca/s/.



If vaccines are needed, please see [Vaccines | HealthLink BC](#) for more information on the specific vaccine your child needs.

Parents, students or caregivers who complete the online consent, will receive a letter closer to the time of school immunizations so you are aware of when the school clinic is occurring.

If consent is not completed online, students will receive a letter and paper consent form from the school close to the time of immunization. The letter will let you know when the consent needs to be returned by.

What if the child had vaccines but they are not on their immunization record?

If the child's record is missing vaccines they already had, please do the following:

1. Find the paper record at home, if one was given to you at the time of vaccination.
2. If you do not have records at home, contact the health care provider who gave the vaccines and ask for a copy of the immunization record.
3. Report the immunizations either of these ways:
 - Submit it online by either scanning this QR code or going to FraserHealth.ca/immunizationform.




