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Principal's Message

September was a monumental and historic month for the staff and students at École Salish Secondary.

After months of planning, it was wonderful to see students and staff in school using the space for teaching and learning. I was thrilled to see teachers co-teaching opening day lessons. I was in awe to see teachers take over and combine 3 classes as they realized we were short teachers. I was grateful when a teacher without a class came and took the class folder from my hand and offered to cover the class. It became obvious that relationships matter and lending a helping hand was to be come the Salish Way of moving and living in our school.

Our students were so excited to be here on opening day. They have carried that excitement through the first month and now into October. I was surprised yet pleased, that students are using the Wolves e-genda to figure out class times and block rotations. After a bit of a delay, we have now been able to load classes into the App which is making it significantly easier for students to keep track of their schedules.

Salish Athletics is up, running and thriving! Thank you to our Athletic Director who has put in so many additional hours after school and on weekends planning and organizing our Athletic Department. With the number of sports teams and clubs that have started, you would think our school had been running for years! We closed out the month of September with our school community participating in Orange Shirt Day. On Friday, September 28, staff and students opened the door to an orange wall of hands. It was a powerful acknowledgement as a school community of Orange Shirt day and a symbolic representation that every child matters. Orange Shirt day began September 30, 2013 in response to Phyllis Jack Webstad's sharing of her experience of arriving at a residential school in Williams Lake and have her new orange shirt taken from her. September 30th is the date chosen every year for the event as it reflects the time of year Indigenous children were taken from their homes and brought to residential schools. Thank you to Lauren Compton for organizing the display of hands. It was a significant message to start our day.

We have accomplished a lot in the month of September but our work is just beginning. The month was like no other one I have experienced as an educator! I have said 'Learning is a Journey'. Our 'Learning Journey' at Salish is just beginning and the path we need to take continues to unfold. As we get to know each other and the 'walls come down', we will create a culture of learning that reflects our values and beliefs as learners and educators.

As we enter our second month at École Salish, our school calendar is quite full. Some of our Grade 11 students had the opportunity volunteer at the Canuck's home opener on October 3rd. It was a great way for them to watch a game and gain volunteer hours. Photo re-takes also happened the first week of October.
