In 1980, 22-year Terry Fox was a student at SFU and had just lost his leg to cancer. Cancer has touched most of our lives in some way. So on a warm and sunny fall day 38 years later, our students had a choice of running or jogging and almost 1200 students and staff were involved. Thank you to everyone who participated and donated or supported our annual school-wide Terry Fox Run, especially Mr. Moy and the PE department for organizing every aspect of these wonderful community-building events. Our school raised and donated almost \$500 to the Terry Fox Foundation

It has been a busy month for our Grade 12 students. All of our Grade 12 students taking English this semester must complete all the requirements of the 4-credit Graduation Transitions or GT to graduate this year. Once complete, students receive a grade of RM for Requirements Met on their report card and Ministry Transcript. Grads of 2019 are reminded that they must complete GT to graduate – please see your Counsellor or the Career Center if you have any questions or need help. Currently, our Grade 12 students have been checking their transcripts to ensure graduation requirement are being met. We have also hosted Universities from across Canada in Mid- October and BC post secondary schools visited us on October 29<sup>th</sup>. These opportunities provide valuable information to our students about entrance requirements and opportunities they can offer. Lastly, thank you to Mrs. Allard and the counselling team for hosting our Grade 12 Parent Night last week. During this night we outlined graduation requirement, post-secondary entrance information for universities, colleges and trade programs. We also outlined scholarship information for our students.
