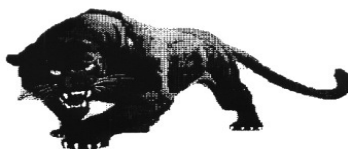



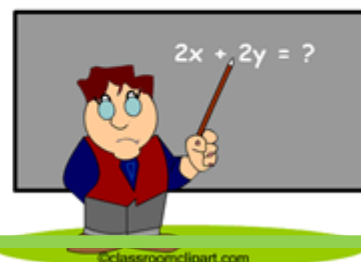
On behalf of all the staff at LTSS, we are looking forward to another exciting year filled with much opportunity and success for our students.

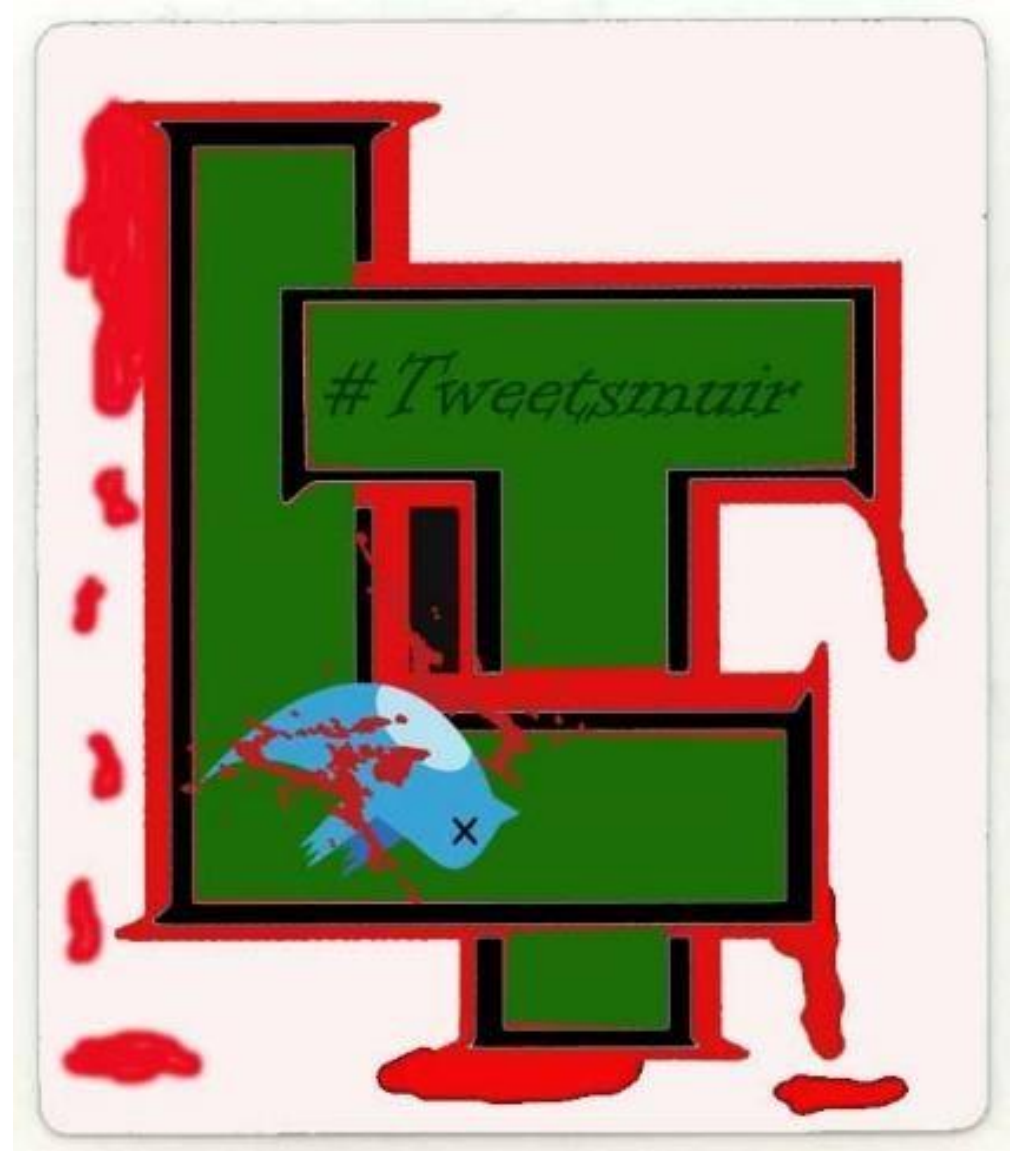

Lord Tweedsmuir's Student's Council is a student-run club, under the supervision of the host teacher, Ms. Christina Smith. In the council, students plan and host different events that help make the school a better and fun place. The council conducts a meeting every week to plan different activities. Students are divided into different committees, with an Executive member as the committee head to supervise everyone. These committees help with different tasks around the school such as collecting supplies for different events, communicating with school staff, and advertising the different events in the school. So far this year, we've hosted two major events, Karnival Kickoff and Orange Shirt Day.



For Karnival Kickoff, various student-run clubs from around the school were invited to advertise their clubs during lunch time. Students and host teachers decorated tables with club-related paraphernalia to advertise their clubs. They also had sign-up sheets in front of the tables so anyone who was interested in joining the club could easily sign-up on the spot. Many students showed up and checked out all the different clubs and signed-

up for the clubs they were most interested in. Student Council set up a Wheel of Fortune, with various prizes and punishments on it. Students tested their luck: some were lucky enough to win gift cards while many had to do jumping jacks, and some got sent away with a passive-aggressive smiley face drawn on a cardboard box.



For Orange Shirt Day, teachers and students filmed themselves talking about truth and reconciliation day and spread awareness about how the indigenous communities were affected through the discovery of many old, unmarked graves of children at residential schools. School staff and students wore orange clothes to show their support towards indigenous communities. The council also put up a board in front of the main entrance with information about truth and reconciliation day and why it is important.

3. Apply **BEFORE** deadline date to Post Secondary Institutions and for Entrance Scholarships!

*Do not forget to add your PSI schools to your Student Transcript Service (STS). All students need to complete the STS by mid April in order to have their interim transcript automatically sent to their selected post secondary institutions and organizations. In July , **final** transcript will be sent.*

4. Self-Reporting Marks... **Check PSI for Deadline Date and webinar on How to Self-Report.**

If required... Student must self-report their interim/final grade 11 and 12 marks through the PSI online account. Once logged, student will be able to check the status of their application and self-report their grades .

Please Note:

All self-reported grades are subject to verification.

Distance/Online Courses—must be 50% or more completed and you must finish by May (TBD)

5. Conditional Offers of Admission

If you meet all of the admission requirements for you program, you may be eligible to receive an early conditional offer of admission

6. Pay Registration Fee by Deadline and Select Courses.

WHAT'S OUT THERE?

Use Education Planner BC's Program Search to find different programs here in BC. Search and focus by subject, location, length of time, or try different keywords or filters.

WHAT FITS YOU?

Compare a few different post-secondary institutions and programs. Do they fit with your career goals, the time you have, and how much you can afford? Many programs offer laddering or transfer opportunities - meaning where you start is not always where you finish.

KNOW YOUR INSTITUTION'S ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS.

Each institution has its own rules on how you can be part of their school, called General Institution Admission Requirements. Know them. Meet them.

APPLY ONLINE

Create one account and apply to multiple post - secondary institutions. *Please check the Post Secondary you wish to attend to see when Applications are due.* You must check the website of the school you are interested in attending. On-line admissions open as early as mid-August so you need to research the important dates for your post-secondary institution.

As a general guideline, the (final) admission deadline for universities falls between December and March.

Application deadlines for BCIT and many Colleges vary by program and may extend into the spring and summer months; you must check the school's website for the specific details of your program.



TRANSCRIPT REQUEST

Please come to the **Career Centre** located in room T202 located on the table in Career Centre to request your Official Transcript. Please allow **three days** for processing.

OR

Do you require a Unofficial Transcript for Scholarship Applications, Out of Province Applications or Specialty Programs? *Student Transcripts Service (STS) is an online application for students to view their school marks and send transcripts electronically.*

HOW TO USE THE STUDENT TRANSCRIPT SERVICE

NEW YouTube [Student Transcript Service Instructional Video](#)

You can order your transcripts online using the StudentTranscript service.

- o You may send up to 25 transcripts to post-secondary institutions at no charge
- o You may send 1 transcript to a 3rd party at no charge. Additional transcripts are \$10 each.

Orders are processed in 3 – 6 business days, then sent electronically or mailed using standard Canada Post letter mail service

You will receive your graduation certificate at no charge from your school once you have met graduation requirements. You can also order copies online using the StudentTranscripts service for \$10 each.

Step 2: Scroll down to Ordering your Transcript or Certificate... You will need to sign up for a BCeID account. Follow the system prompts to register for Student Transcript Service (STS)

For STS, you will need:

 Date of Birth
 Email Address

Step 3: Once you have completed registration for a BCeID account, you can continue to Student Transcripts and fill out your student information to access your transcripts.

Affiliation Scholarships

Eligibility for these awards is usually determined by connection to a sports association, trade union, company or demographic group. There are also awards for students with medical conditions. The Military also offers scholarships. Awards are offered throughout the year and deadlines vary by the individual scholarship.
