PARENTS AS PARTNERS

Thinking Games

Families spend lots of time together and are on the go. Whether walking to the mall or going to the park or doing errands, try these thinking games with your child to help sharpen their creativity and thinking skills.

Would You Rather. In this game each player takes turns offering two choices to decide upon. For example, would you rather live on a beach or in the mountains? The other players choose and give reasons for their choices. Then the next player gives two choices for another activity and the process continues again.

Three Favourites: This game requires players to choose a topic such as books, movies, action figures, cities and name their three favourites. After each rotation a new topic is chosen.

What Doesn't Belong: A player lists a group of items such as ostrich, canary, owl and asks, "Which one doesn't belong?" The other players have to guess which one and state why.

As kids practice these games, their creativity and thinking will definitely improve!

COMMUNICATING STUDENT LEARNING AT NORTH RIDGE

This year your child may receive one of two different reporting formats to communicate your child's learning.

Communicating Student Learning (CSL) Template: This reporting format will be a written document received three times per year. It will include both teacher and student assessment and reflection on your child's learning goals. The CSL reports will be issued December 7, March 14 and June 27.

Digital Electronic Portfolios (FreshGrade): Some teachers may choose to use FreshGrade, which is an electronic, on-line portfolio that is updated in an ongoing manner throughout the year. FreshGrade students will also receive a paper summative document in June. If your child's teacher is using this format, you will have received a FreshGrade parental consent letter.

REMEMBRANCE DAY ASSEMBLY

We invite parents and guardians to attend this very special and solemn ceremony on Thursday, November 8th at 9:00 am. We meet as a school to honour and pay respect to Canadian War Veterans and world peacekeepers. At North Ridge we also take the opportunity to look for hope and peace in our world for all. The Student Leadership Team challenged the school to raise \$800 for the Terry Fox Foundation this September. Fundraising picked up quickly when they announced that Mr. Redding would be duct taped to the gym wall during an assembly! In a week we raised \$840 dollars! The next step was to buy 10 rolls of duct tape and then.... Mr. Redding was indeed taped to the wall during our September 28 monthly assembly. WEATHER UPDATE

It looks like our beautiful sunny and dry weather has come to an end. This is a reminder that all students will be expected to go outside at recess and lunch each day. Students will only be kept in during extremely poor weather. Children should be dressed to go outside with appropriate clothing and footwear. Waterproof coats, rubber boots and umbrellas are recommended for our rainy climate. Some children may wish to keep a change of clothes or socks at school. This will ensure that you are not called during the day to bring dry clothes.

ALLERGY~AWARE SCHOOL

Several of our students at North Ridge have severe life-threatening allergies/allergic reactions to peanuts, nuts and their by-products, as well as other food products. Please help us in doing everything possible to protect these students. Some ways you can help include: refraining from sending food to school that contain peanuts/nuts, remind your child to wash their hands carefully after eating if there is an anaphylactic student in your child's classroom, remind your child to not share or trade snacks and do not use these products in any treats that you may send into the classroom throughout the year. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we continue to make our school a safe environment for all of our students.

Please inform the school immediately if your child has a severe life-threatening allergy or medical condition so we can ensure appropriate procedures are in place



HALLOWEEN AT NORTH RIDGE

We will be having our Halloween Integrated Day on Wednesday, October 31st. The teachers have planned a great day for the students with fun activities. The Primary classes have planned a Halloween craft rotation amongst their grade groups and there will also be a primary costume parade through the classrooms in the afternoon. Students are invited to wear their costumes to school on Halloween. A reminder from our Safe Schools Department regarding Halloween costumes: "It is expected that students will not use, possess or display any weapon, replica weapon or toy weapon, on any school property or at any event that is organized or sponsored by a school." Please remind your children that replica or toy weapons are not allowed at school even if they are part of their Halloween costume. Masks may be worn inside the school as long as they are not violent in nature.

HALLOWEEN IN THE COMMUNITY

We are asking that all students be aware and practice all safety rules on Halloween. Every Halloween, children and adults are seriously injured and sometimes killed by fireworks. According to Surrey and White Rock bylaws, it is illegal for any person to be in the possession of fireworks of any kind. The only exception is for persons who have a valid federal supervisor's certificate from the Explosives Regulatory Division of Natural Resources Canada. However, city permits must be obtained and other restrictions still apply. The penalty for violating the bylaw is a fine of up to \$5,000 and seizure of the fireworks. Any fireworks brought on school property will be confiscated and students involved face suspension. Please report any suspicious activity around the school grounds after school hours and especially throughout the week up to and including Halloween. We will have Security on site at North Ridge during Halloween so that our school is monitored that night.

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PALS

Parents as Literacy Supporters Program

At North Ridge Elementary School

2018/2019

Attention all 3-4 year olds. North Ridge will be hosting 5 PALS sessions this year and 1 Ready, Set, Learn session. PALS and Ready, Set, Learn are Surrey school district programs for parents and their 3 and 4 year old children. It is designed to build the connection between home and school and to get ready for kindergarten. Each session focuses on early literacy and numeracy skills through games, activities and songs. Families will take home a goodie bag, books, as well as ideas and strategies to support their children with literacy development. This is a parent participation program so all parents are required to stay throughout the sessions. Sessions will be from 8:35 a.m. ~ 10:45 a.m., in the school Library. Please note that in prior years we have had the PALS sessions on a Friday but they will now be held on a Monday.

The following is a list of the dates for both programs:

Session 1: Mon, Dec. 3 Session 2: Mon, Jan. 14

Session 3: Mon, Feb. 11

Session 4: Mon, Mar. 4

Session 5: Mon, April 15

Ready, Set, Learn: Fri, May 10* different time: 1-2 pm

Each session includes:

- Fun activities for parents/caregivers to do with their preschooler
- Snack time
- Time for parents to learn new ways to help their children learn
- Stories and songs
- A take home bag full of things to do and use at home such as a tool kit with scissors, pencils, glue, a book and materials related to the session activities (magnetic letters, markers, etc.)

PALS is a great way for young children to become more comfortable and confident at school and to get ready for Kindergarten. And PALS is completely **FREE!**

You will be required to give your child's name and age, plus a phone number and e-mail address where you can be reached. Space is limited, so please register early and commit to all of the sessions.

VIRTUE OF THE MONTH

NORTH RIDGE READING PROGRAM

North Ridge Elementary students are **Reading for Gold.** Each night in which students read, or, are read to, for a minimum of 15-20 minutes they fill in a line of their reading log. Students will earn 1 point for each night they read. In the spirit of the Olympics, when they reach Bronze, Silver, Gold levels, they will get a certificate, their name in the newsletter and their name displayed on the medal podium in the school.

Here are the levels:

50 nights of reading: Bronze 100 nights of reading: Silver 150 nights of reading: Gold

Furthermore, each month that students complete 20 nights of reading their name will go into a draw for prizes. Names will be drawn during the monthly assembly for prizes.
