

Return to Separate Primary and Intermediate Lunch

Last year, due to Covid19, most schools in Surrey divided the 45 minute lunch into separate times for primary and intermediate students to be outside and play. This was very successful and provided students with additional space and opportunities that don't happen when the school yard is full.

Given we have over 120 more students outdoors at lunch time, the field and playground is very busy. There is increased risk for injury and conflict. For these reasons, starting Monday the 4th, we will return to separate outdoor times for primary and intermediate as follows:

11.50 am Primary students go outdoors, rain and shine (divisions 8-13)

Intermediate students wash and eat (divisions 1-7)

12.10 pm Primary students return inside to wash and eat with their lunch monitors

Intermediate students go outdoors, rain and shine

12.35 pm Class resumes

Monthly Assemblies Return Face to Face

We are once again able to safely meet in the gym for separate primary and intermediate assemblies. Our Orange Shirt Day/Truth and Reconciliation assembly was powerful as we learned about the Residential school system of the past, the damage it has done to generations of Indigenous people, and listened to stories of both sadness and strength in the present.

On the first Friday of every month, we will gather as primary and intermediate communities to celebrate student growth, learning and achievement. This time also allows us to explore emergent themes that are part of our school culture. This month, we celebrated Terry Fox and his legacy.

At this time, we are not inviting parents to join us. We hope this may change if Covid transmission rates decline.
