

Special Report from Constable Pannu of the White Rock R.C.M.P.

- Increasing concern from parents, school staff, and admin about the drop-off/pick-up situation for students who are driven to/from school. Specifically, that the "Drop Off Zones" directly in front of the school property on the north side of Roper are not always being respected, and parents are parking there and leaving their cars unattended to take children into the school in the mornings.
 - o use **common sense** and **courtesy** when dropping off/picking up at school.
 - o **respect the Drop Off Zone**s and do not leave your vehicle unattended.
 - o pull into the Drop Off Zone, pull as far forward as possible, let your child out, and depart.
 - o do not stop in the "through lane" (active traffic!) to let your child out.
- White Rock Community Policing Volunteers will be observing and issuing reminders during school drop-off for the next two weeks (Feb 20 Mar 3rd), and R.C.M.P. will begin issuing tickets to violators the following week (starting Mar 6th).
- The intention is to keep the flow of traffic moving in and out in an orderly and timely way, so that everyone has a space to drop off their child SAFELY.

- To clarify, there are TWO Drop Off Zones on the north side of Roper (westbound traffic only):
 - 1. from the driveway/gate of the lower grass field, west until the main crosswalk on Roper
 - 2. from the main crosswalk on Roper, west until the staff parking lot driveway

Treasurer's Report ~ per Laura C.

- Oliver!, Cheque-Writing Campaign, and Round 1 Hot Lunch totals are finalized and updated in the financial report.
 - Oliver! cost PAC a net total of approx. \$2k between last year and this year
 - the Ravens jerseys cost \$600 more than planned, so between the musical underspend and the jersey overspend, we are expecting to come in at least \$2k under budget.
 - o the final Cheque-Writing Campaign total for this year is \$10,726.70.
 - o Hot Lunch Round 1 netted approximately \$5250, which is \$350 more than expected.
- Because the Gaming Account budget is expected to be under-spent, our available playground reserve has increased to approx. \$5k (assuming \$40k reserve for 2017/18), or \$10k if we want to reduced next year's PAC reserve to \$35k.

Playground Committee ~ Sean

- Feb 10, had a meeting with Sean, Ms. Thorvaldson, Mme. Chalifour, and playground supervisor Mr. Farris
 - o Consensus is to seek playground structures that can be used by various ages & multiple kids at the same time.
 - Observation of a lot of kids digging holes in the baseball diamond; would a sand pit be worthwhile?; get city involved, to reduce maintenance costs of the baseball diamond?
 - o Grades 6 & 7 not playing on playground as much; need a social area instead of play area; tables and chairs?
 - o lots of dog waste on field!; request from Mr. Farris for PAC to address the City of White Rock on this subject
- Cambridge Elementary has a great new playground, good example; Feb 24th next meeting for Playground Committee.
