## Active Transportation and Walk to School Wednesdays

Today, we had our kick-off assembly for our Active Transportation initiatives. Students learned
that active transportation is human-powered transportation that connects your destinations. You might:

- Walk to the grocery store
- Cycle to your friend's house
- Kayak to a picnic
- Scoot to school

If you get to your destination under your own power, that's active transportation!

Our student assembly emcees shared some information (from ministry websites) such as:

- Only $21 \%$ of Canadian children and youth, aged 5 to 19 , typically walk or wheel to and from school, while $63 \%$ use inactive modes like a car or bus.
- Increased car use makes school zones congested and less safe. Congestion and unsafe driver behaviours are common around schools during bell times.
- The increased physical activity specifically associated with the school journey has been found to increase alertness and attention during the school day and better academic performance.
- When kids walk, bike, or roll to school, they improve their physical and mental health, reduce carbon emissions, and increase road safety in their neighbourhoods.

Students are encouraged to plan for Active Transportation to and from school as much as possible, and they will need your help! Walk, roll, or scoot to school! Please help your child plan for active transportation. If you are driving from far away, a great suggestion is to park some distance away from the school and walk the rest of the way. This will provide opportunities for fitness and fresh air as well as reduce traffic and congestion in front of the school.

On Wednesdays, teachers will survey their students, and each week, the class wit' ${ }^{\prime}$ most active transportation will be the proud recipients of the Golden Shoe Awar
